DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE TO JUNE 9, 2009, AND
STAYING THE PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 27), extending the target date in the above captioned investigation to June 9, 2009 and staying the procedural schedule.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted Inv. No. 337-TA-601 on April 27, 2007, based on a complaint filed by InterDigital Communications Corp. of King of Prussia, Pennsylvania and InterDigital Technology Corp. of Wilmington, Delaware (collectively, "InterDigital") on March 23, 2007. *72 Fed. Reg.* 21049 (March 23, 2007). The complaint, as amended, alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the

importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain 3G wideband code division multiple access handsets and components thereof by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 6,674,791; 6,693,579; 7,117,004; 7,190,966; and 7,286,847. The notice of investigation named Samsung Electronics Co., Ltd. of Seoul, Korea; Samsung Electronics America, Inc. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey; and Samsung Telecommunications America LLC of Richardson, Texas (collectively, “Samsung”) as respondents.

On November 24, 2008, InterDigital and Samsung filed a joint motion to stay the procedural schedule in the investigation and to extend the target date until no earlier than June 9, 2009. The Commission investigative attorney did not object to the joint motion.

Also on November 24, 2008, the ALJ granted the joint motion and issued the subject ID, extending the target date to June 9, 2009, and staying the procedural schedule, including issuance of the final ID. No petitions for review of this ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in section 210.42 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. § 210.42).
