How is VA increasing partnership opportunities with faith-based and other community organizations?

VA partners with faith-based and other community organizations to create new and innovative pilot and demonstration programs that help provide better service to our veterans in need. We also have partnership opportunities with many existing programs.

Loan Guarantee Program for Multifamily Housing

Through this new initiative, VA can guarantee loans to organizations that construct or rehabilitate multifamily transitional housing for homeless veterans. To qualify for a loan guarantee, the applying organization must also provide support services such as job placement and training to veterans seeking employment; and drug and alcohol addiction counseling to veterans trying to maintain sobriety.

FBCI= VetSuccess Program

VA's Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Service (VR&E) is partnering with faith-based and community organizations (FBCO) to provide service-connected disabled veterans opportunities to seek employment, career advancement, job mobility, family economic well-being, and greater financial security. FBCOs can participate by identifying service-connected disabled veterans within their organization and community that are unemployed or under-employed or may need supportive services and inform them about this initiative and who to contact to obtain additional information.
