"They ensured that every detail was handled, such as securing porta potties, providing publicity ahead of the event, and leading the efforts on Saturday." Smith Valley Rotary Club prepared a great barbecue lunch; Forest Service staff also had a chance to meet new volunteers and discuss a wide variety of topics.
