The Chequamegon Bay Area is among the best birding destinations in the Midwest, with a wide variety of habitats hosting nearly 300 bird species. With over 110 activities to choose from, birders and nature lovers of all skills and ages will find a wealth of choices at this year's festival.

Nationally renowned educator and humorist David Stokes will offer special hands-on programs featuring songs, stories and live critters for audiences of all ages.

Late May is the peak of spring migration and therefore the ideal time to visit the Chequamegon Bay Area. Migrating and resident birds mingle during this time of year, some setting up their summer homes and others just passing through the area. The warming temperatures also keep birds active, so there is a greater chance to view a wide variety of bird species.

The Northern Great Lakes Visitor Center, located at the intersection of U.S. Highway 2 and County Highway G in Ashland, WI, will serve as the home base for the event.
