



The *Wasatch Canyons Tomorrow* process is your opportunity to provide input to an update of Salt Lake County’s 1989 Wasatch Canyons Master Plan. The Wasatch Canyons Master Plan guides land use policy, decisions, and ordinances for all of the eastern canyons in unincorporated Salt Lake County, including the upper portion of City Creek, Emigration, Red Butte, Parleys, Millcreek, Big Cottonwood, and Little Cottonwood. The canyons’ management is critical to the residents of our region, as they provide more than 50% of the drinking water for over 500,000 residents, and significantly add to the quality of life for residents of Salt Lake Valley.

With the doubling of county’s population in the next 30 years, *Wasatch Canyons Tomorrow* will strive to ensure the long-term health of these treasured canyons, balancing land-use, transportation, and environmental concerns.

Salt Lake City, Salt Lake County, and the State of Utah are the principal sponsors of the *Wasatch Canyons Tomorrow* process. Envision Utah is facilitating data collection and public participation. The U.S. Forest Service is a supportive partner and providing technical assistance.
