Widespread Use in Vietnam



If you served in Vietnam, between January 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975, you may have been exposed to an herbicide called Agent Orange.



Agent Orange Exposure

May Lead to Certain Diseases



The diseases associated with Agent Orange exposure are:

- Chloracne
- Type II Diabetes
- Hodgkin's Disease
- Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia



Agent Orange Exposure

May Lead to Certain Diseases



- Multiple Myeloma
- Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma
- Porphyria Cutanea Tarda
- Prostate Cancer
- Respiratory Cancers
- Soft Tissue Sarcoma

The Agent Orange Registry Program offers veterans the opportunity to receive a complete health evaluation and answers to questions about Agent Orange exposure and health problems.
