Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product, a synthetic organic chemical, Isoxaflutole, is the active ingredient in formulated herbicides for use on crops. The subject product is imported from Finland.

Technical comments:⁴

The Commission staff suggests that an existing heading, 9902.11.46, be used for the new duty suspension by changing the rate of duty from “4.8%” to “Free” and by modifying the effective date.

⁴ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ISOXAFLUTOLE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7 new heading:

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1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) applies to articles entered, or withdrawn
