Bill No. and sponsor: H.R. 4600 (Mr. Emanuel Cleaver of Missouri).

Proponent name,³ location: Bayer CropScience, Research Triangle Park, NC.

Nature of bill: Renewal of temporary duty reduction through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

β-Cyfluthrin (CAS No. 68359-37-5) (provided for in subheading 2926.90.30).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product, a synthetic pyrethroid insecticide, is formulated into application products for use on crops and in the pest control industry. The subject product is imported from India.⁴

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. β -CYFLUTHRIN.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.02.54 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking “12/31/2006” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
8 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
9 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
10 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
