1. <u>GRANTEE</u>: ConocoPhillips Alaska, Inc. Anchorage, AK

2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:

- a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain DOT Specification drums containing Hypochlorite solutions, which exceed the quantity limitations when shipped by air. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
- b. The safety analyses performed in development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
- c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.
- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 172.101 Table, Column (9B) in that the quantity limitation for cargo aircraft is exceeded.
- 5. <u>BASIS</u>: This special permit is based on the application of ConocoPhillips Alaska dated November 29, 2005, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING - Packaging prescribed is a DOT Specification UN1A1 steel drum or a UN1H1 plastic drum with a capacity of 55 U.S. gallons. The drums must be corrosion-resistant or have protection against corrosion in accordance with § 172.102, Special Provision A7.

b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS -

- (1) Transportation by cargo aircraft only is authorized from ConocoPhillips Alaska's base of operations in Deadhorse, AK to the Alpine Oilfield located 60 miles SW of Deadhorse, AK.
- (2) Only the following air carriers are authorized under the terms of this special permit:

Northern Air Cargo, Anchorage, AK

Air Cargo Express, Fairbanks, AK

Lynden Air Cargo, Anchorage, AK

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

- a. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.
- b. MARKING Each DOT Specification drum must be marked "DOT-SP 13282" as specified in § 172.301(c).

- c. Packagings permanently marked 'DOT-E 13282', prior to November 1, 2006 may continue to be used under this special permit for the remaining service life of the packaging or until the special permit is no longer valid. Packagings marked on or after November 1, 2006 must be marked 'DOT-SP 13282'.
- d. Shipping papers displaying 'DOT-E 13282' may continue to be used until November 1, 2006, provided the special permit remains valid.
- 9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Cargo aircraft only.
- MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each aircraft used to transport packages covered by this special permit. The shipper must furnish a copy of this special permit to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.
- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 <u>et seq</u>:
 - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
 - o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
 - o Registration required by § 107.601 $\underline{\text{et seq.}}$, when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)- 'The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005' (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term 'exemption' to 'special permit' and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 - Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 - Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
