- RSC must be available 24/7
- Must provide TSA:
 - Names
 - Titles
 - Phone Number
 - Email

What Does a RSC Do?




- Serves as TSA's first point of contact for communication of transportation security issues
- Allows TSA to participate in two-way communication with owners and operators
- •Serves as an information sharing resource to his or her organization
- Coordinates security practices with law enforcement and emergency response entities
