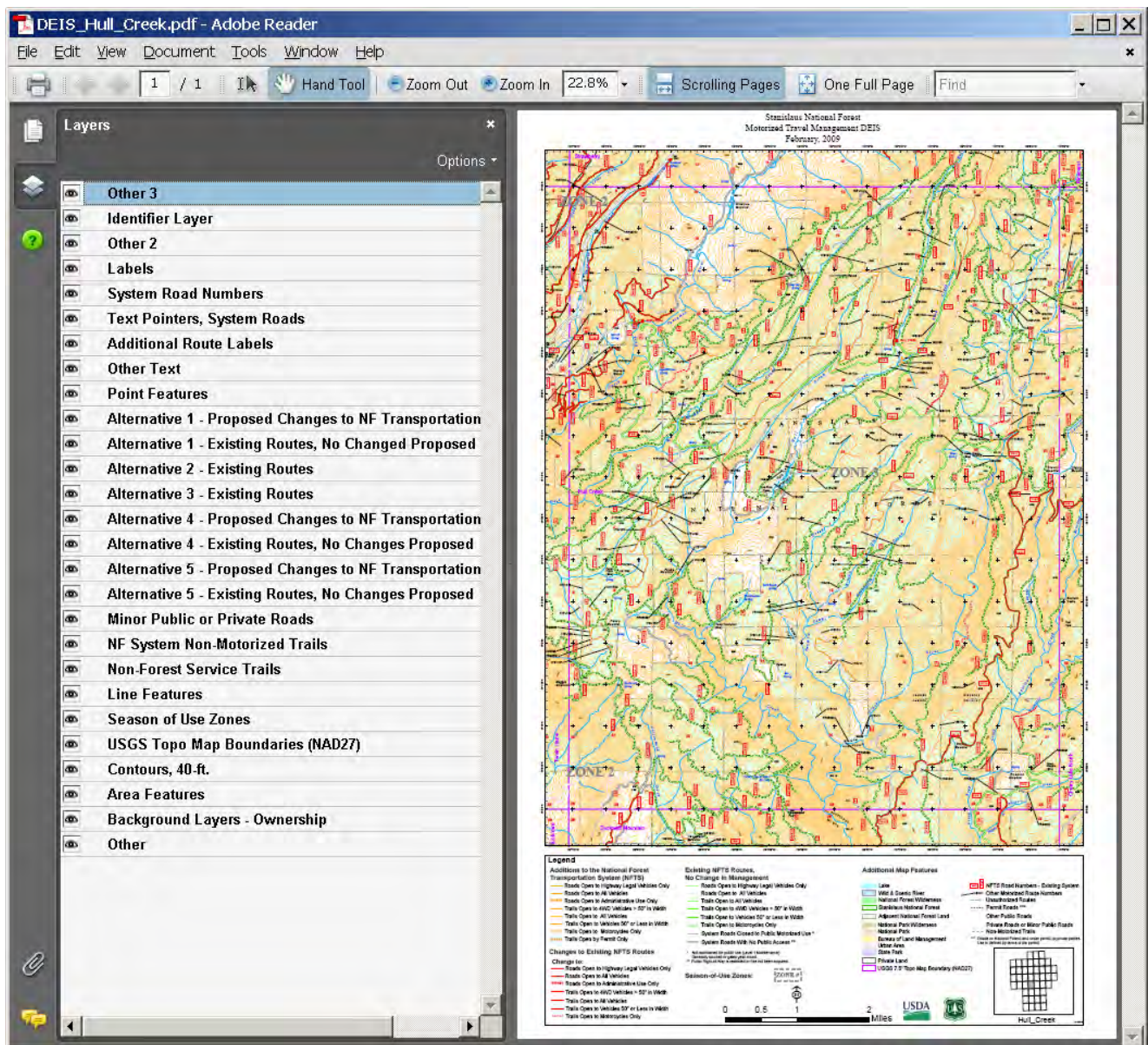


PDF Maps

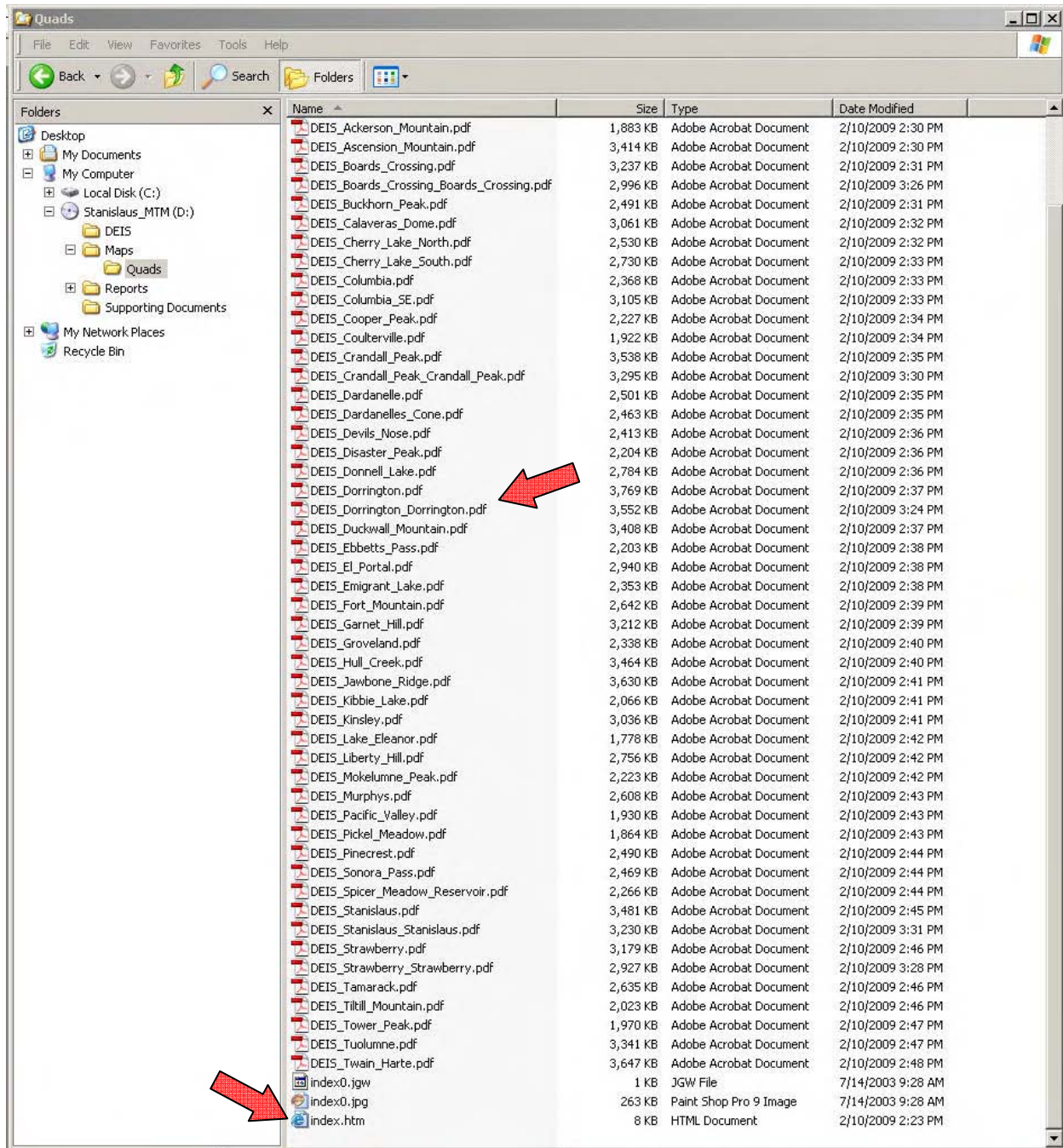

ACCESS QUAD MAPS TWO WAYS

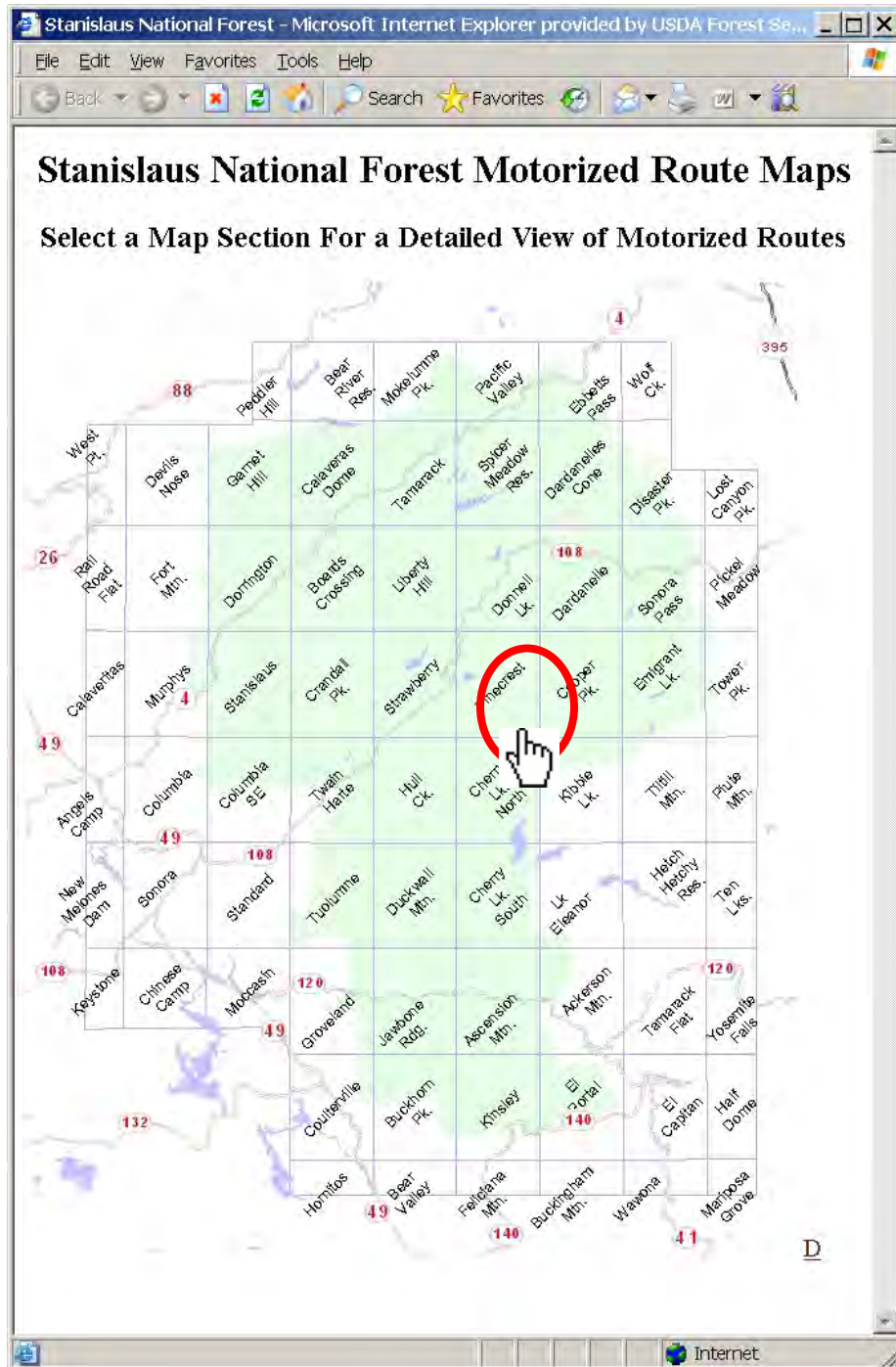
DEIS Appendix I (Route Data) lists the route numbers along with the quad location for all additions to the NFTS and changes to the existing NFTS. Once you determine which quad to view:

1. The first way is to use the Index page. Open the [index.htm](#) file in the Quads folder. The index page shows a forest map, indexed to the USGS topo quad maps.
2. The second way is to navigate to the Quad folder and open the desired map to view the file.



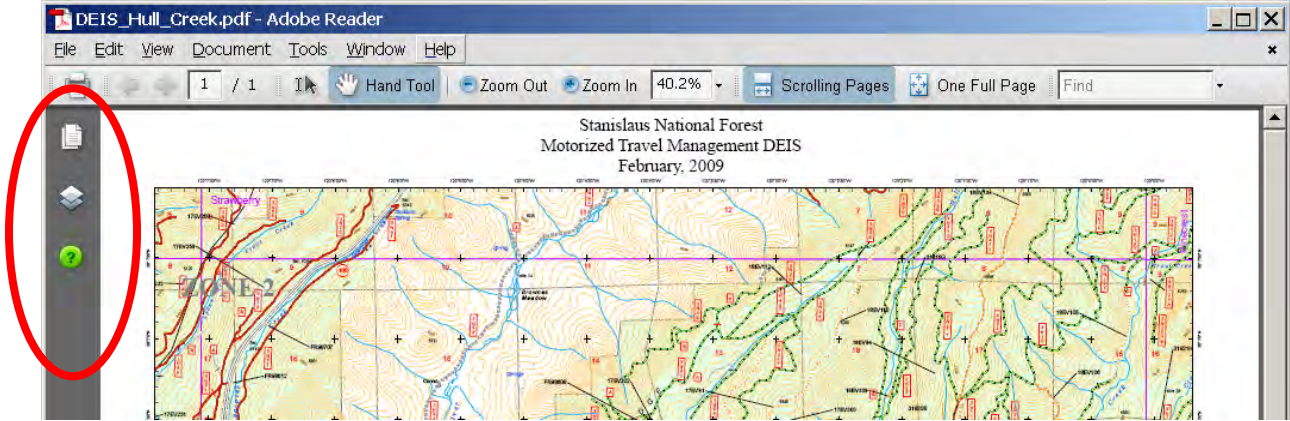
INDEX PAGE

The index page allows the user to select and open a specific quad to view the pdf map document. As you move the mouse over the quads the pointer changes to a hand which means that the quad links to an associated map document. Exterior quads without National Forest Service land within the quad boundaries are not included. To view another quad use your browser's "Back" feature to return to the quad index.

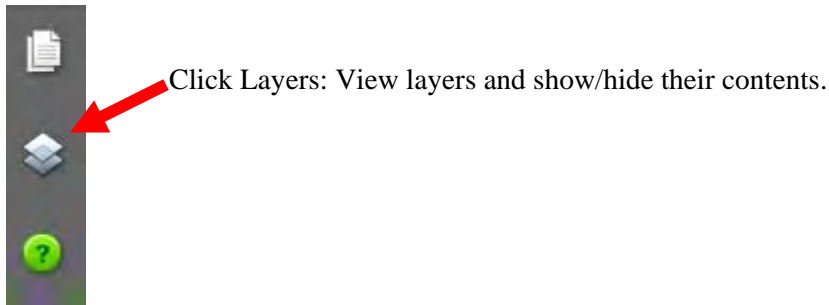


CUSTOMIZING YOUR MAP

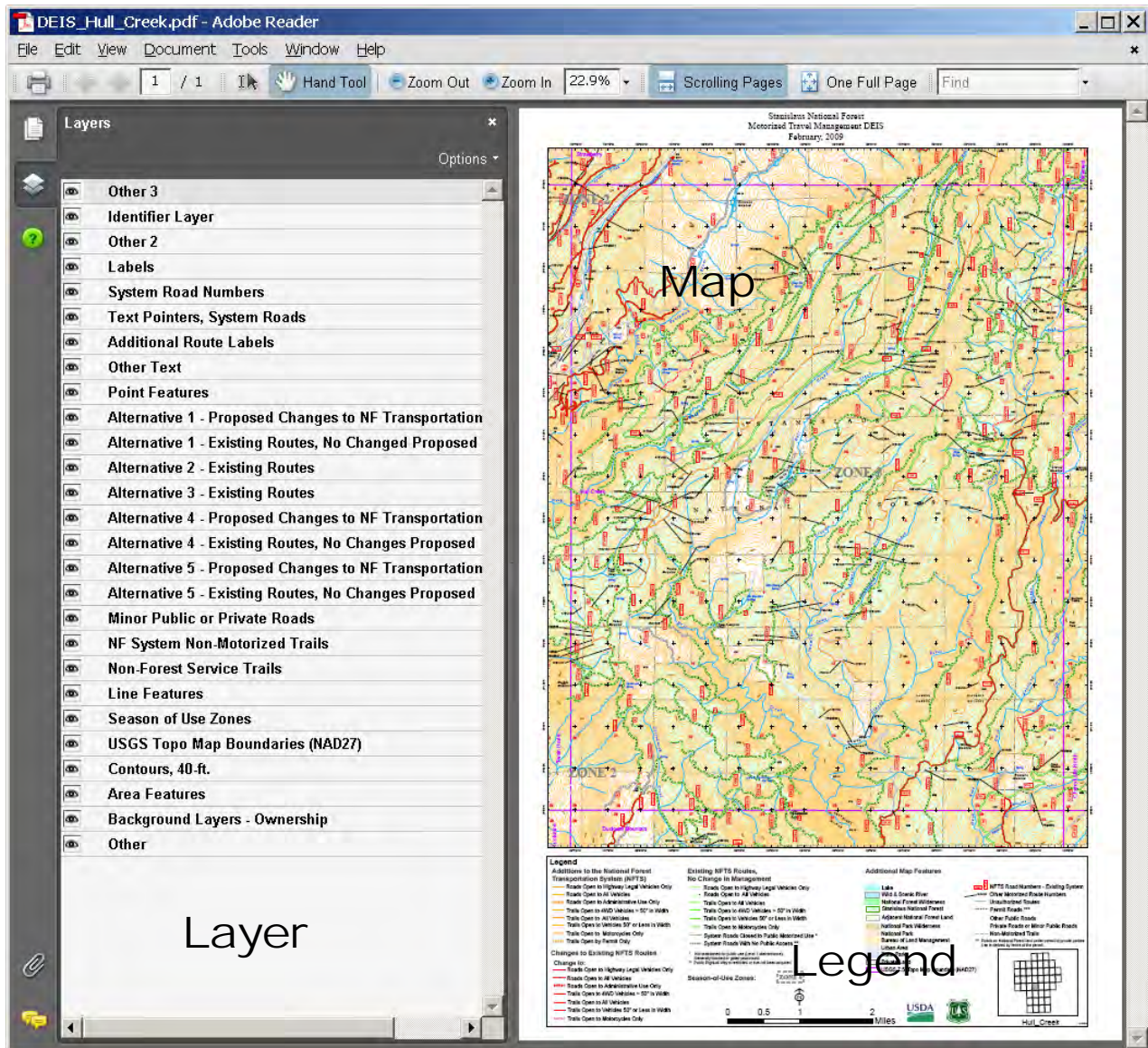
If the icons below do not appear in Adobe Reader you may have an older version and must download a current version.

To hide or view certain layers click on the button to turn the eye off or on.

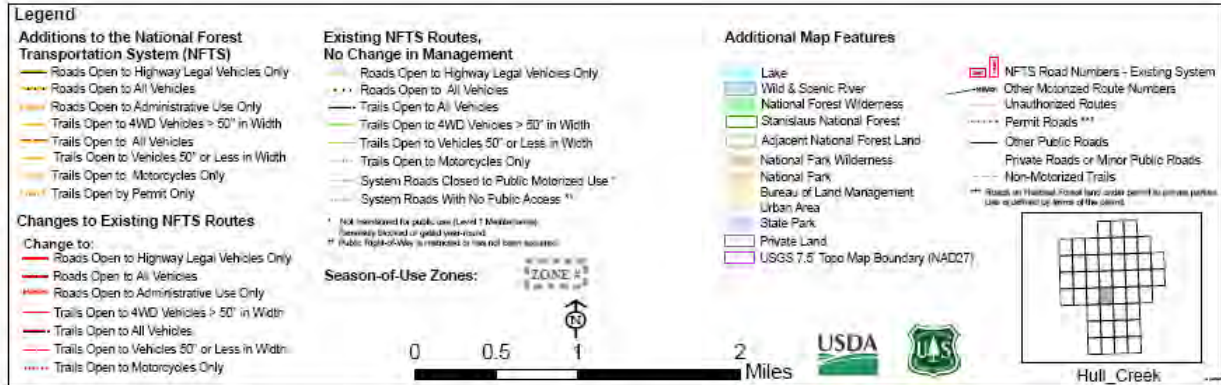


Layer is visible. Click to hide layer.

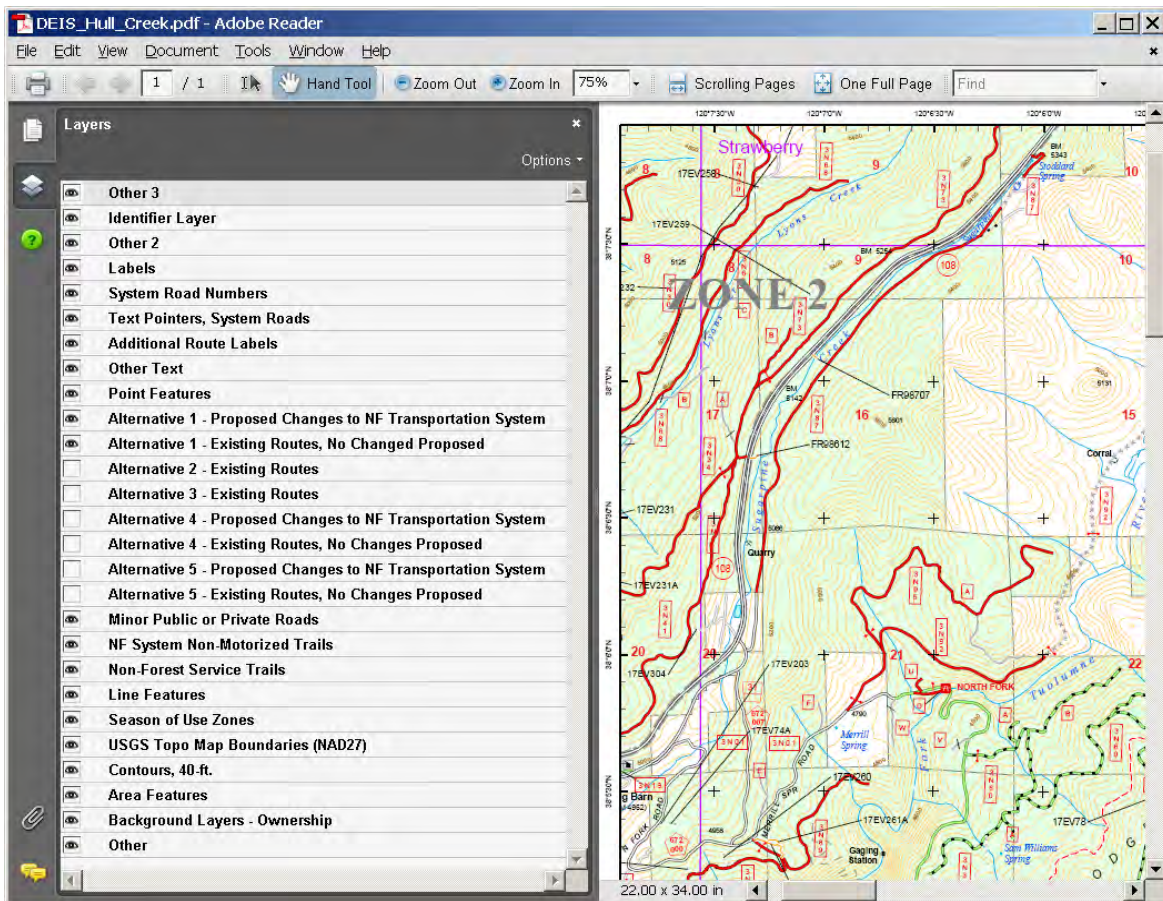


Layer is hidden. Click to show layer.

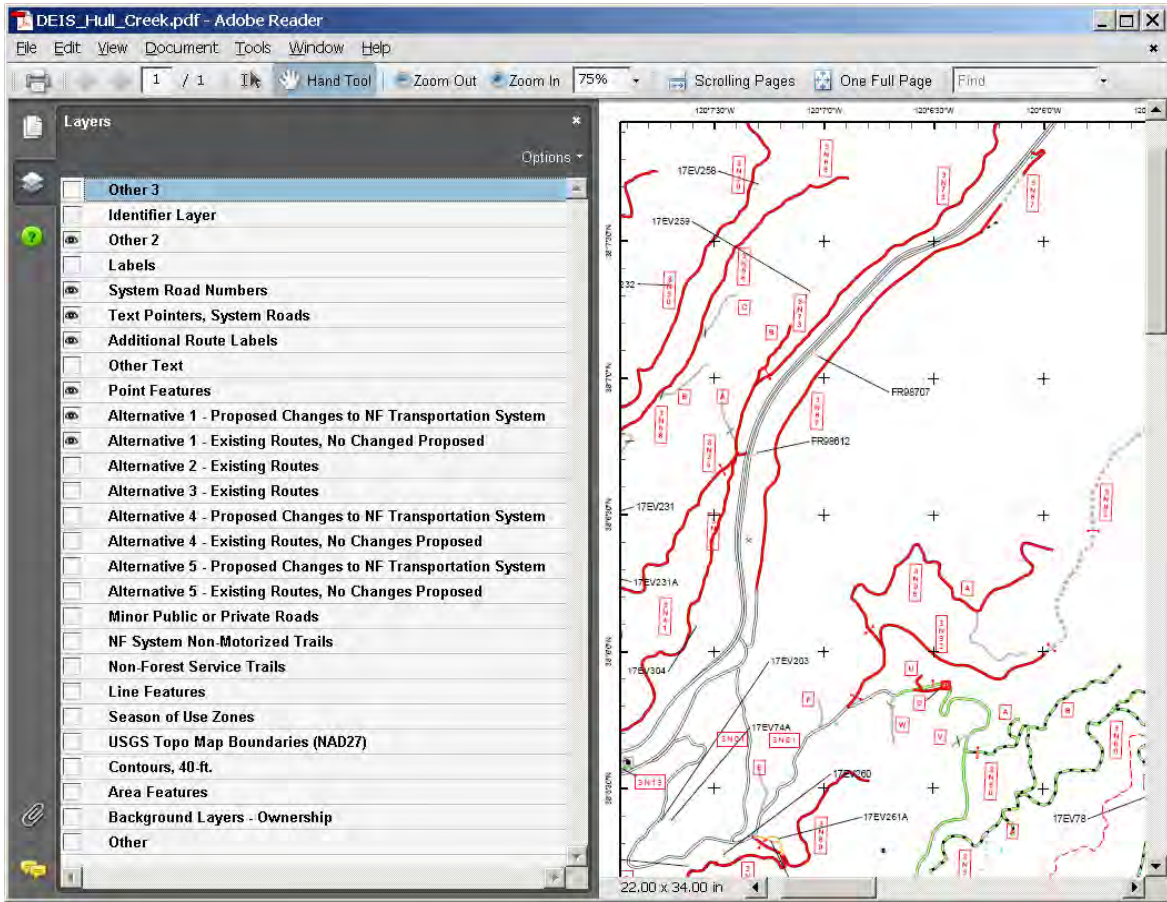

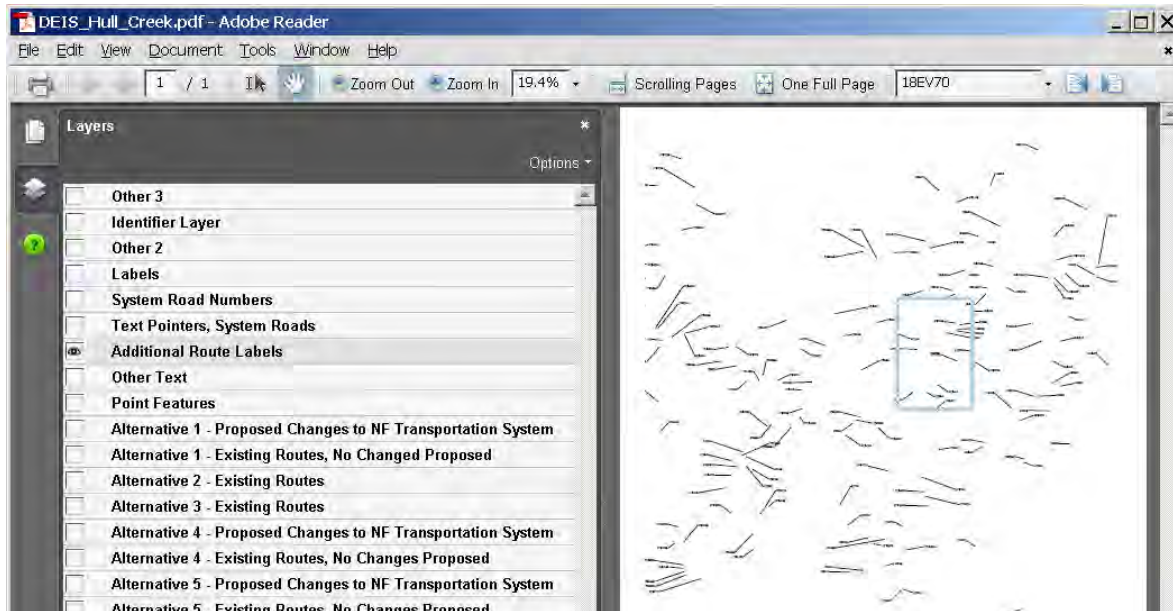
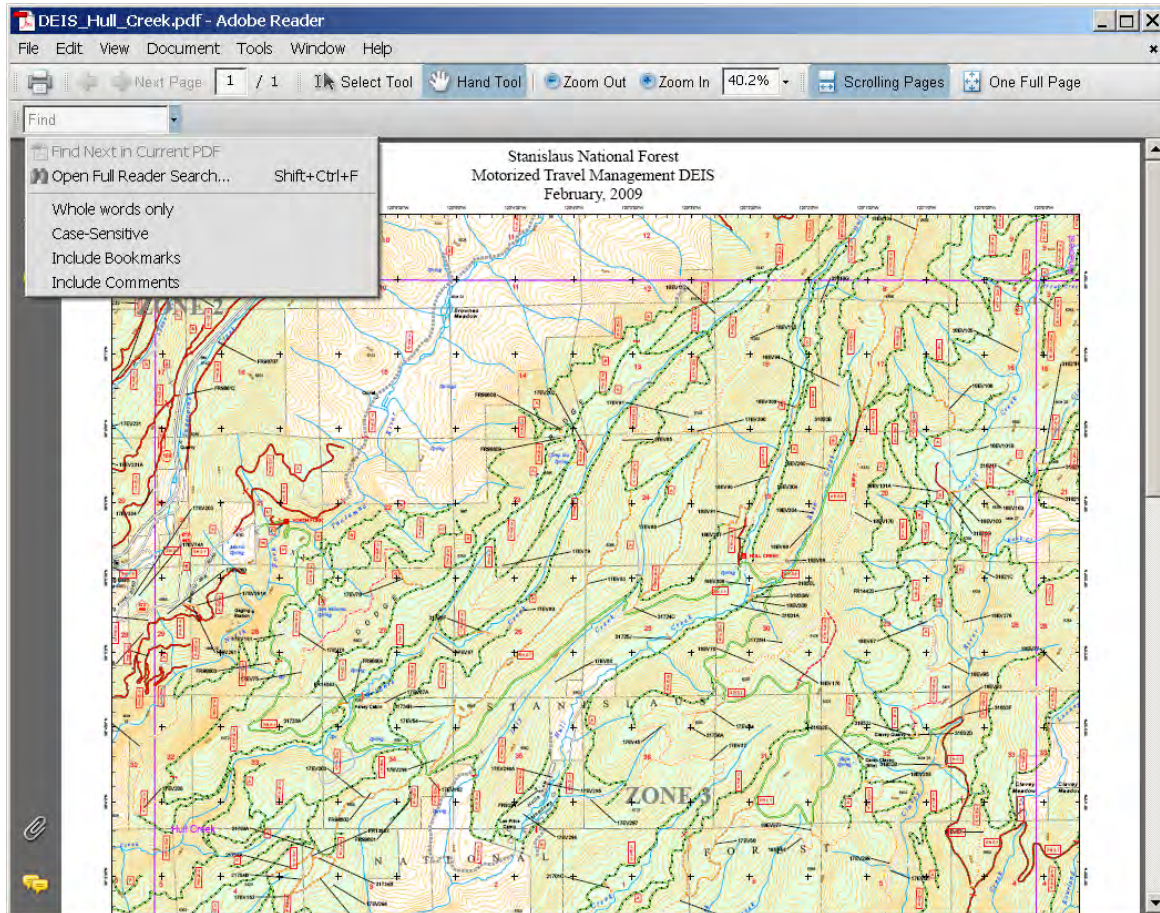
VIEW ALTERNATIVE 1 ONLY

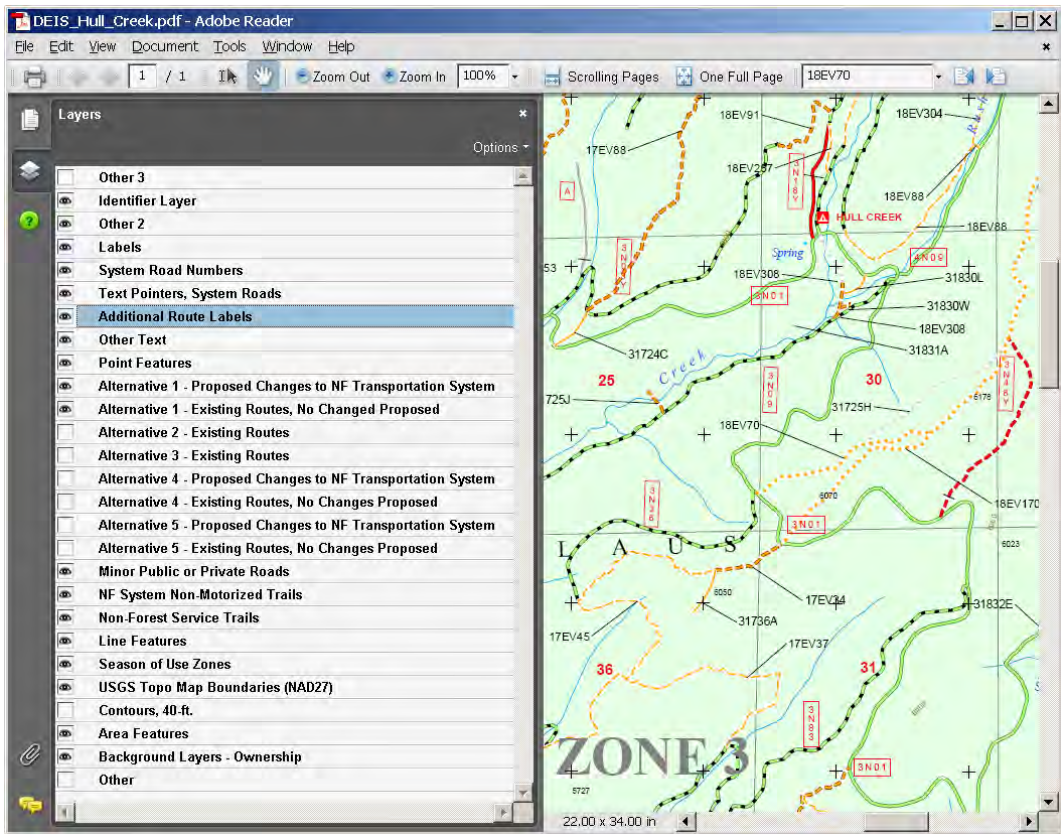
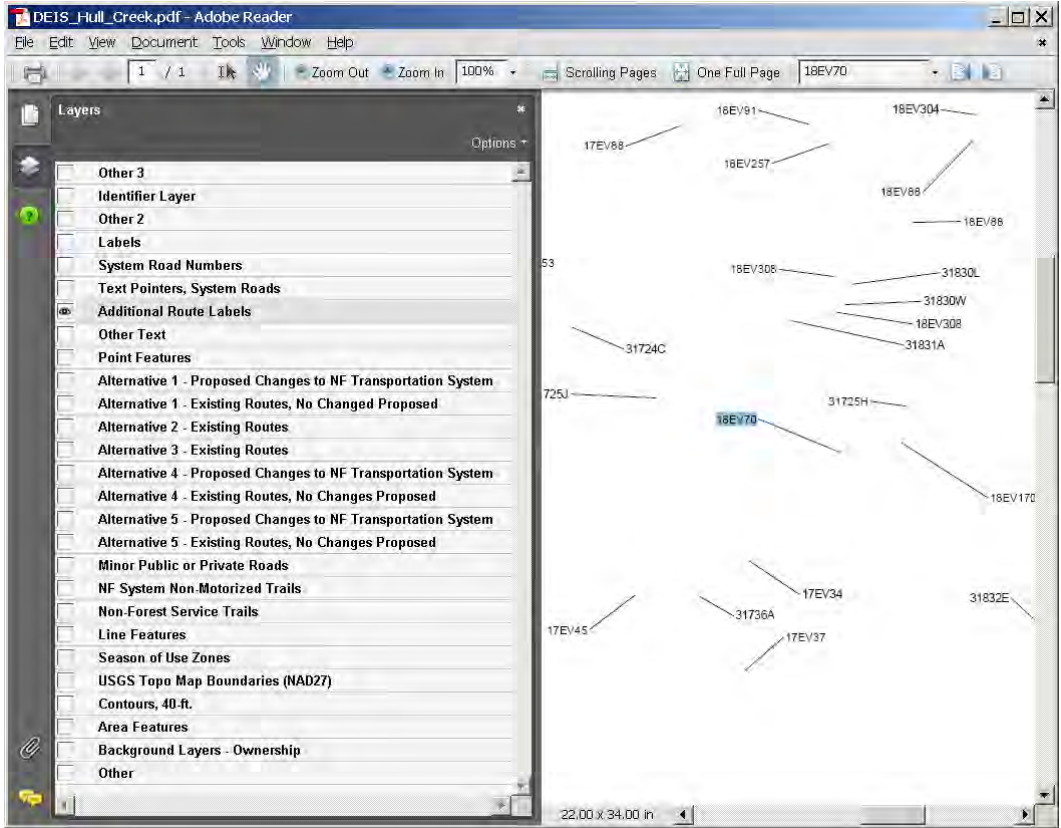


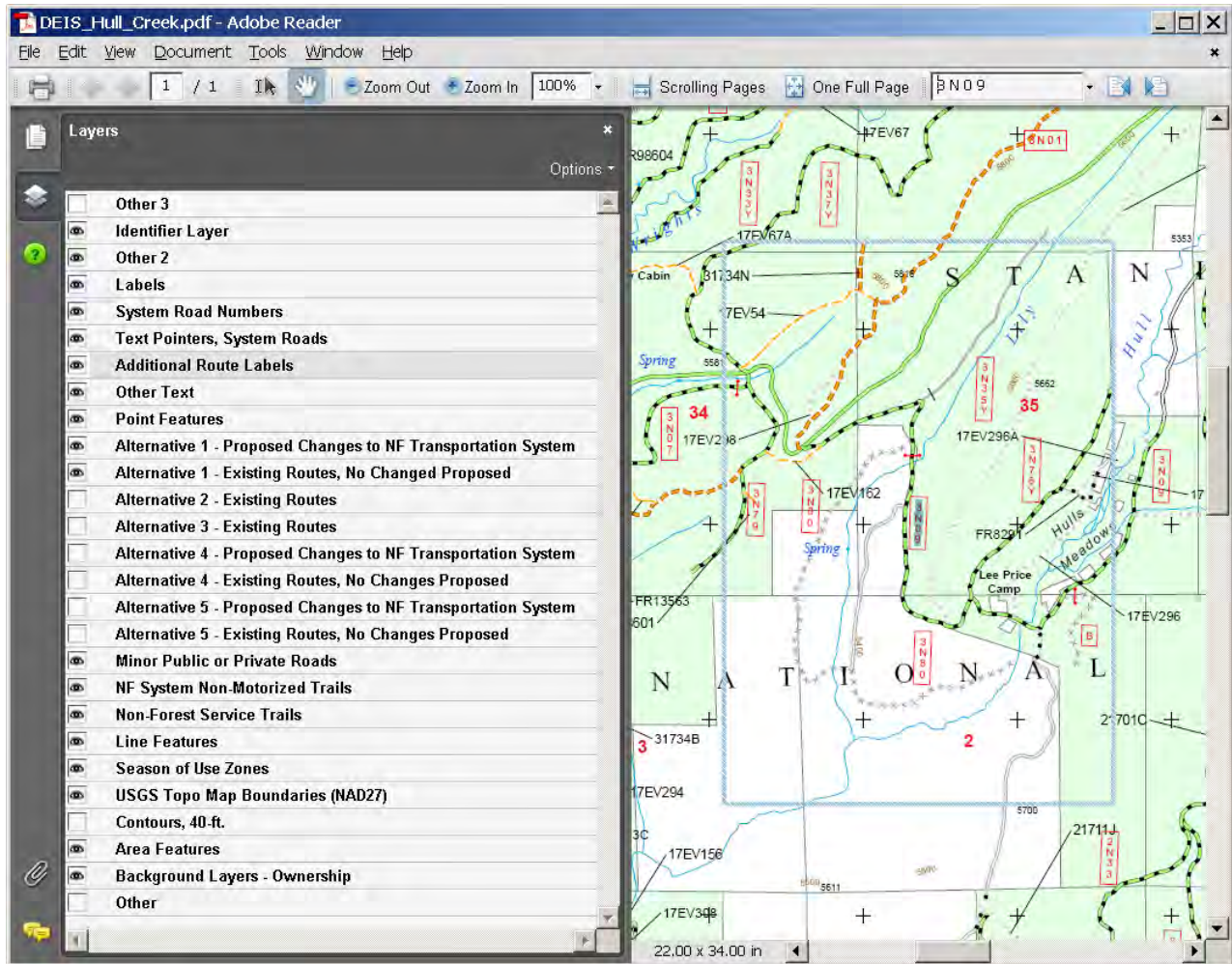
VIEW ROUTES AND ROUTE LABELS WITHOUT OTHER LAYERS

Note: To search for some of the System Roads you must put a space between the numbers and characters:

3 N 0 9

After you hit enter or use the find Next/Previous  buttons then Adobe Reader will show you the area where the text label is located. The search will find any string of text that matches what you typed in. ie 3N01 and 3N01B. The search will only apply to the active pdf map.
