### **The Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area Seeks Public Comment on the The Coyote Wall (Syncline)/Catherine Creek Trail Project Environmental Assessment**

**HOOD RIVER, OR** – The Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area, USDA Forest Service, has completed the Environmental Assessment for the Coyote Wall, Burdoin and Catherine Creek Area Recreation (Trail) Plan and is seeking public comments on the Plan. A public meeting will be held on February 3, 6:00-8:00 pm at Pioneer Center in White Salmon, Washington. The meeting will introduce the alternatives being considered, rational behind them and provide a time for questions. Participants may also submit any comments during the meeting.
