2008 Accomplishments

Native Plant Materials Program

- Initiation of Forest-wide native plant materials program.
- Long-term vision to provide local seed and seedlings to restore native vegetation on National Forest System land, with emphasis along Colorado's high-profile Front Range.
- Contracted with Upper Colorado Environmental Plant Center in Meeker, Colorado, to increase seed of three native grasses and seedlings of one native shrub over next three years.
- Collaborated with Boulder County Parks & Open Space on desired species, restoration goals and seed collecting in Boulder's foothills.
- Entered agreement with Rocky Mountain Youth Corps to assist in seed collecting.


Seed Collections:

- Collected 66 pounds of Parry's oatgrass, mountain muhly and nodding bromegrass for increase.
- Collected 60,000 seeds of antelope bitterbrush to grow as seedlings and for seed reserves.

Preparation for Seed Increase:

- Species will have germination studies.
- Grasses will undergo seed increase over next three years if species show adequate germination.
- 1000 bitterbrush seedlings will be grown over project life, remainder as needed over long term.
- Fields cultivated for initial 2009 seed increase of one grass, other grasses to increase in 2010.
