Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest: Native Plant Program Greenhouse

2008 Accomplishments

The Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest continued to expand its successful Native Plant Program in 2008 with the addition of a greenhouse at the Oconto River Seed Orchard (ORSO). We now have a fully-automated, year-round greenhouse for the Forest's Native Plant Program.

Several projects will soon get underway using in the new greenhouse: 1) native wildflowers and grasses will be grown to augment the Lakewood Ranger Station's native plant/pollinator garden; 2) Path rush (*Juncus tenuis*) plugs will help control erosion on FS boat landings; 3) Districts will get native shrubs for their landscaping needs; and 4) The State-endangered Dwarf Bilberry (*Vaccinium cespitosum*) will be propagated for reintroduction to frost pockets on the Lakewood District. And that's just the beginning!
