## Native Plant Pollinator Garden for the Cranberry Mountain Nature Center

## 2008 Accomplishments

Native Plant Funding in FY08 was distributed to the Gauley District of the Monongahela National Forest for a native plant/pollinator garden at the Cranberry Mountain Nature Center. One sign has been erected noting that the garden is intended to attract Monarch Butterflies. Interpretive signage detailing the plants contained in the garden will be added in FY00, along with a web page on

Interpretive signage detailing the plants contained in the garden will be added in FY09, along with a web page on the Monongahela website for internet visitors.

Approximately 300 plants were planted in a 6x60' garden. The garden is next to the nature center, along a sidewalk which allows handicap access. The garden area features a birdbath and a finch feeder. Hummingbird feeders hang nearby on the building. A flagstone separation in the garden leads into the shade of a large maple tree, which serves as a picnic area for visitors. One end of the garden path turns into the interpretive trail, the other end features benches at the butterfly milkweed garden, with views of the hummingbird feeders, the finch feeder and the beautiful Highland Scenic Highway.

The garden features columbine, wild bergamot, coreopsis, aster, blazing star, beardtongue, oxeye daisy, blackeyed Susan, bee balm, phlox and wild geraniums and a section of butterfly milkweed.

Several areas of native wildflower/grass meadows will be planted this fall, which will also be interpreted with signage.
