These five murals follow crucial moments in our judicial system's evolution. Beginning with the Magna Carta of 1215, the first charter of liberties guaranteeing fundamental rights and privileges is established as the English barons confront King John. The Mayflower Compact of 1620 represents the communal formation of government, and the Constitutional Convention of 1787 shows the "Great Compromise" granting each state two representatives. The image of Rosa Parks and the Montgomery Bus Boycott, 1955-1956, illustrates judicial impartiality that led to the desegregation of public transportation. The final courtroom scene illustrates the privileges afforded by the Bill of Rights.

Born in New York City in 1949, **Lincoln Perry** graduated from Columbia University and received his M.F.A. from Queens College in 1973. Perry has completed murals for the University of Virginia in Charlottesville as well as public and private commissions.
