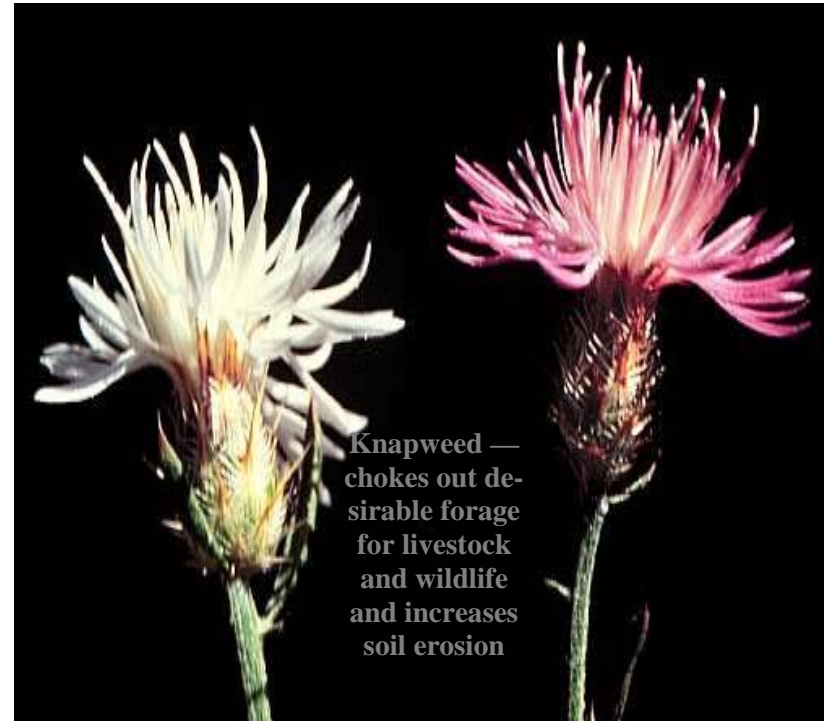




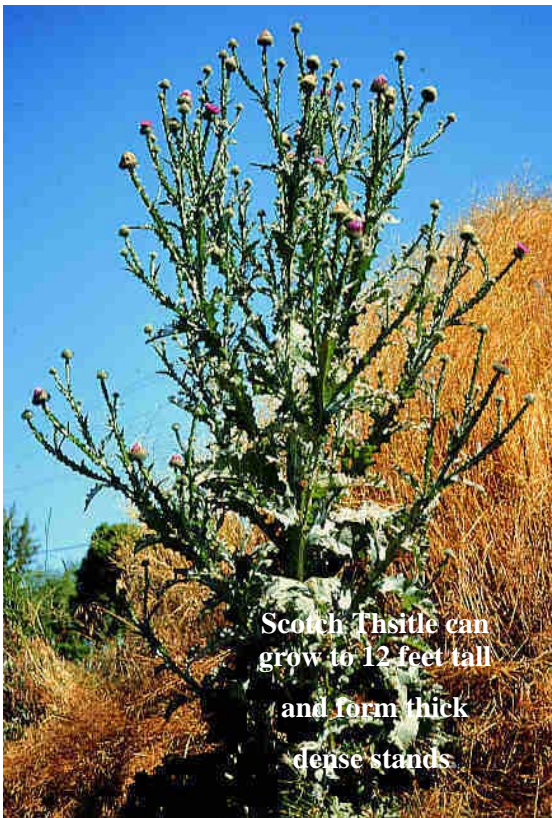
Toad flax—Yellow snapdragon-like flowers. May be poisonous to livestock



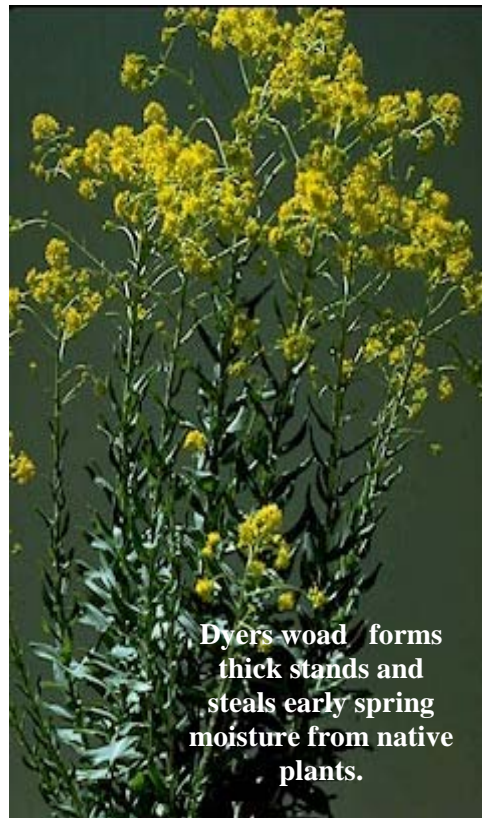
Leafy spurge—aggressive invader that can overtake large areas of open land.



Knapweed — chokes out desirable forage for livestock and wildlife and increases soil erosion



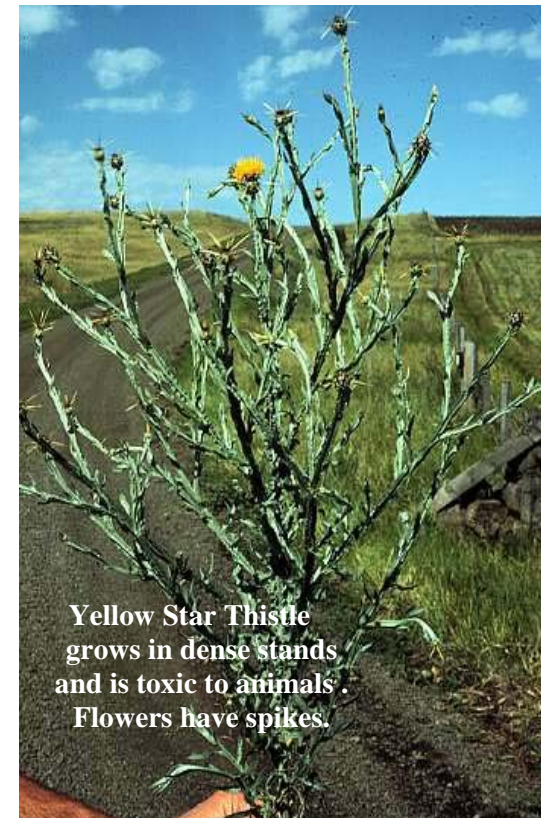
Scotch Thistle can grow to 12 feet tall and form thick dense stands



Dyers woad forms thick stands and steals early spring moisture from native plants.



Houndstongue forms dense stands. Seeds spread is aided by velcro like structures that attach to shoes and socks



Yellow Star Thistle grows in dense stands and is toxic to animals. Flowers have spikes.
