Producing no injuries, the tornado traveled about one mile before lifting **Chicot County** 0015CST 0200CST 10K Flash Flood Dermott 24 Heavy rainfall from showers and thunderstorms placed numerous streets under water in the city. Minor street flooding was reported in the community of Symonds and six houses were overcome with three to five feet of water in the city of Rosedale **Jefferson County** 5K Thunderstorm Wind (G60) Countywide 0930CST Winds associated with a severe thunderstorm blew numerous trees down across the county. **Warren County** Countywide 5K Thunderstorm Wind (G60) Numerous trees were blown down across the county. **Lincoln County** 19 Thunderstorm Wind (G60) 5 SW Brookhaven 1115CST 0 0 12K Severe thunderstorm winds blew down numerous trees and powerlines across the area. It moved 5.5 miles northeast through the city, resulting in approximately 50 injuries and damage to numerous buildings. In all, over 150 homes and 95 businesses were either damaged or destroyed. The most extensive damage occurred near the city's Wal-Mart, which received heavy roof damage. The tornado lifted just northeast of the intersection of State Road 15 and Interstate 20 **Jasper County** 19 1322CST 0 3K Thunderstorm Wind (G60) **Bay Spgs** A few trees were blown down across the city. **Lauderdale County** Countywide 19 1400CST 0 0 Hail(0.75) Lauderdale County 3.5 SW Vimville to 1 NW Vimville 150 33K Tornado (F0) 19 3 A tornado touched down around 2:20 PM, about 3.5 miles southwest of the community of Vimville. It moved three miles northeast across Lauderdale County, toppling numerous large trees and damaging almost twenty other homes, barns, and mobile homes. The tornado lifted about one mile northwest of the city **Forrest County** 10 S Bonhomie 23 2035CST Hail(0.88) **Forrest County** .5 N Mc Laurin 23 2045CST 0 0 Hail(1.00) **Bolivar County** 5K Flash Flood Rosedale 23 24 2300CST 0200CST Heavy rainfall resulted in street flooding in the city. **Rankin County** 2330CST 0200CST 0 15K Countywide Flash Flood Thunderstorms moving over Rankin County resulted in flooding across the county. The worst reported flooding occurred in the Brandon and Richland areas. In Brandon, several homes were flooded in the Winchase, Bradford, and Westwind subdivisions, where some sandbagging was taking place. In Richland, one foot of water was covering all lanes of U.S. Highway 49 in the city **Sunflower County** Countywide 24 0005CST 0 10K Flash Flood Heavy rainfall produced street flooding in the community of Drew, with water covering parts of other roads in the county. **Hinds County Byram** 24 0035CST 5K Flash Flood 0245CST Five inches of water covered the road at the intersection of Big Creek and Siwell Roads **Washington County** 0050CST 0245CST Flash Flood Greenville 7K 24 Heavy rain caused portions of U.S. Highway 82 and Lake Ferguson Road to be under water. **Adams County**

Yazoo County 0 1 150K Yazoo City 31 0410CST 0412CST 1.5 50 Tornado (F1) A tornado touched down about one-half mile southeast of the intersection of U.S. Highway 49W and State Road 3 around 4:10 AM. The tornado then moved northeast approximately 1.5 miles over western sections of the city. The worst damage along the path occurred at the Shady Lane apartment complex, where a roof was ripped from one of the buildings. In addition, several windows were shattered in an adjacent building, with flying debris resulting in damage to other buildings. One female resident of the apartment complex was treated and released from an area hospital with a shoulder injury.
