The storm then moved to the NE as it slowly weakened into a Tropical Depression. The center of the system basically tracked along Interstate 59 before moving into Alabama around 6 AM, July 1st. Heavy rainfall with the system resulted in several reports of flash flooding. Forty-eight hour rainfall totals ranged between 3 and 7 inches, mainly across SE portions of Mississippi. Gradient wind gusts between 30 and 40 mph combined with saturated soils to down numerous trees very close to center's track.
