Tropical Storm Arlene made landfall near the Alabama/Florida state line and tracked northward across western Alabama through the evening of the 11th. The western periphery of the tropical storm effected far Eastern Mississippi during the evening and brought gusty winds and locally heavy rains to that portion of the state. Peak wind gusts were reported up to 40 mph and the combination of

wet soils allowed for a few hundred trees to get blown down or uprooted. Several of the downed trees took down power lines and a small few landed on homes causing damage. Additionally, the counties across Eastern Mississippi received 3 to 5 inches of rain as Arlene lifted north.
