Categorized by race/ethnicity and sex, subcohorts are further divided by sport.

Students receiving athletically-related student aid are defined in the Student Right-to-Know regulations 668.48(a)(1)(iv)) as those entering students (full-time, first-time degree-seeking undergraduates) who athletically-related student aid for any period of time during their entering year. Completers within 150% of Normal Time (61, 62, 68)

In order to calculate a graduation rate to comply with Student Right-to-Know regulations, institutions ca as completers only those students who received their degree/certificate (or completed a transfer-prepar program) within 150% of normal program time. See Glossary for definition of normal time to completior count as completers students who get their degree from another institution.

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Completed <2-yr within 150% (61) - Enter the number of students who completed programs of less years within 150% of normal time.
