
This Week In CDC History

Rules

Give us your honest, insightful feedback. Consider this your professional soapbox—but with a few limits:

If you identify yourself:

- Your comment will post immediately.
- · Your comment will be reviewed by the blog moderator after it's posted.
- If it does not conform to these rules, offensive portions or the entire comment will be deleted.

If you remain anonymous:

- Your comment will be reviewed by the blog moderator before it is posted.
- If your comment conforms to these rules, it will be posted as is.
- If it does not conform, offensive portions or the entire comment will be deleted.

Your comments must relate to CDC. This is not the place to talk about your personal issues, political beliefs, push your child's fundraiser, or discuss any other non-business related issues.

Your comments must relate to the topic at hand. Comments must have something to do with the topic in the original post. If you wish to start a new topic, send your idea or your draft post to <u>CDC</u> <u>Connects Story Ideas</u>.

No personal attacks are allowed. It's OK to disagree with a colleague's position on an issue. It's not OK to question his or her character. No comments with an insulting, inflammatory, or disrespectful tone will be allowed. In particular, malicious responses that insult others based on race, ethnicity, gender, religion, nationality, or sexual preference will not be tolerated.

What We've Learned 51 Posts, 2400 Comments Later

- Most active discussions: on topics that affect daily work life
- Least active discussions: on scientific or programmatic topics
- Many managers are reluctant participants



Discussions easily wander off topic





Successes

- "I like this blog. It's good to have a venue like this to talk about things."
- Increasing numbers of comments → Increasing participation
- Management seeking input through blog
- Management actions as a result of blog discussions





Challenges

- Increase discussions led by CDC leaders and managers
- Encourage use of discussions/ feedback in management decisions
- Increase guest posts
- Increase awareness among employees
