The Games, a great patriotic, sports, and health/fitness story, run through Saturday, July 8, 2006. GAMES KICK-OFF

11:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. Town Square

The Kick-off includes a welcome to the city by Anchorage Mayor Mark Begich, and a wheel-chair quad rugby exhibition by talented Games competitors as well as able-bodied visitors from local news organizations. Wayne Miller, one of the veteran participants and a combat-wounded Vietnam veteran, will sing the National Anthem. Great photo and interview opportunities as an air horn is sounded, calling for the Games to begin. Great time for early Games photos and interviews.

OPENING CEREMONIES

6:30 p.m. Sullivan Arena

The spectacular Opening Ceremonies begins with a parade of the athletes, identified by state or national flags representing 46 of the United States, Puerto Rico and Great Britain. Speakers include VA Under Secretary for Health Dr. Jonathan Perlin and PVA National President Randy L. Pleva, Jr. Special treats are Alaska Native dancers, balladeer "Hobo Jim," and country star Luke Stricklin, who leads the national anthem with the athletes' children. A Vietnam veterans motorcycle club and wheelchair honor guard will present the colors. Later, the torch comes in by dog sled! A welcome reception follows. This is a colorful, festive event, perfect for early Games coverage. **Great time for early interviews. Let the Games Begin!**
