

Saturday, July 1, 2006 LET THE GAMES BEGIN!

The 26th National Veterans Wheelchair Games take place all this week (July 3 through July 8) at the Egan Convention Center, Bartlett High School, Sullivan Arena and other area venues. The Games, a great patriotic, sports, and health/fitness story, **are the largest annual wheelchair sports event in the world**. The event is co-presented by the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Paralyzed Veterans of America. **Actress Bo Derek**, National Honorary Chairperson of VA's National Rehabilitation Special Events, is at the Games early in the week. Sunday, July 2, 2006 - Veterans Arrive in Anchorage!

- More than 500 veterans with disabilities from across the United States, Puerto Rico and Great Britain will arrive in Anchorage all day to prepare for the Games. More than 30 veterans injured in Operation Iraqi Freedom are joining the competition this year, most for the first time.

Monday, July 3, 2006 – Here Come the Veterans!

- Games Kick-off/Quad Rugby Exhibition, Town Square, 11:30 a.m. The Kick-off includes a welcome to the city, followed by a spirited quad rugby ("Murderball") exhibition. Athlete Wayne Miller will sing the national anthem. Great sports action to kick off the Games!
- Opening Ceremonies, Sullivan Arena, 6:30 p.m. Top VA and PVA leaders will also address the athletes, including VA's Under Secretary for Health Dr. Jonathan Perlin and PVA National President Randy L. Pleva, Jr. Athletes parade in with their teams from across the U.S., Puerto Rico, and Great Britain, in colorful Team attire. Special treats are Alaska Native dancers, balladeer "Hobo Jim," and country star Luke Stricklin, who will lead the national anthem with the athletes' children. A Vietnam veterans motorcycle club and wheelchair honor guard present the colors. Later, the torch comes in by dog sled! After the torch is lit, a welcome reception follows with food and entertainment.

- Fourth of July Parade, Downtown, 11:00 a.m. More than 500 registered wheelchair athletes will lead off Anchorage's annual Fourth of July Parade through downtown Anchorage, with competitor and 2005 "Spirit of the Games" winner Orlando Perez serving as this year's Grand Marshall.
- Handcycling, Downtown, 2:30 p.m. Event begins just as Sadler's Ultra Challenge ends.
- **Slalom**, Bartlett High School, 3:00 p.m. High emotion, lots of action as wheelchairs go for the gold in this unique obstacle course competition.
- **Basketball**, Sullivan Arena, 3:00, 7:30, 9:00 p.m. <u>Great</u> basketball action, colliding chairs, cheering crowds! Watch games 1-6 today. More basketball is on Thursday evening and Friday.
- Power Soccer, Cellular One Sports Center, 7:30 & 9:00 p.m. Soccer for power wheelchairs.

- **Power Chair 220,** AFS/Sullivan, 3:30 p.m. A track event for motorized wheelchairs to see whose chair goes fastest.
- Power Chair Relay, AFS/Sullivan, 4:00 p.m. A great, fun, exhibition event just for motorized wheelchairs.
- Block Party, Town Square, 5:30 p.m. Anchorage welcomes the veterans and their guests.
- **Basketball**, Sullivan Arena, 7:30 & 9:00 p.m. Lots of fast action and loud cheers for the winners in Games 7,8,9 & 10. See who will be in the basketball finals tomorrow!
