Goal and Objectives

Gather specific information from communities on how government agencies and partners can better support community-based conservation, management and educational initiatives.



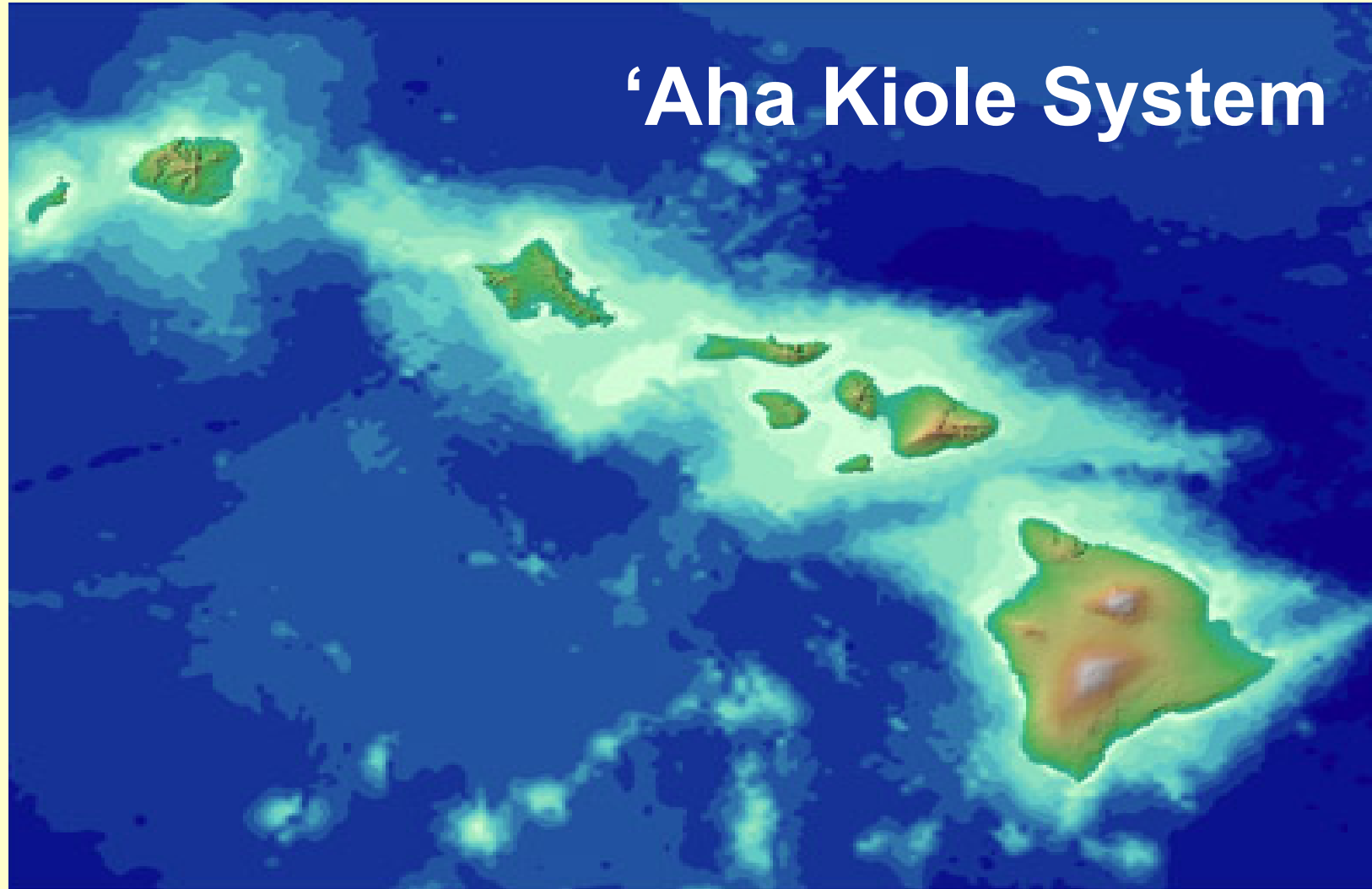

Preliminary Findings

- Common Obstacles and Challenges to community-based initiatives;
- Actions government agencies and non-government organizations can do to better support community-based initiatives.

Obstacles and Challenges

- Individual's Time and Capacity
- Sustaining community participation
- Communication (at all levels)
- Education of broader community on why work is important
- Understanding that Gov't doesn't have all the resources it needs to fulfill all mandates and responsibilities

Actions

- Improve opportunities for communication and networking (go to communities)
- Provide additional technical and financial support to help communities become self-sustaining;
- Reassess legislative acts, policies, and laws codes that contradict each other or impede communities from taking action.
