About ECD

The Energy Citations Database (ECD) was created and developed by the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Office of Scientific and Technical Information (OSTI) with the science-attentive citizen in mind. ECD contains energy and energy-related scientific and technical information collected by the DOE and its predecessor agencies, with historical content beginning with the Manhattan Project.

Contains

Electronic Documents

- Primarily from 1943 forward
- Indexed full text
- Searchable and Downloadable
- Beginning in the 1940's
- For reports, books, conferences, journal articles, dissertations, and patents
- In chemistry, physics, materials, environmental science, geology, engineering, mathematics, climatology, computer science, and oceanography

Features

Fielded Search

- Multiple field searching
- · 'Sort by' capabilities
- Relevancy ranking selection
- · 'Limit to' capabilities

Subject Select

- Assists in identifying terms for subject searches
- Controlled vocabulary
- Hierarchical structure, with categories and subcategories

Author Select

• Assists in identifying variations of author's name

Bibliographic Citations

- · Identifies multiple authors
- Selected authors are 'submitted' to Fielded Search

Alerts

- Capability to create subject-specific alerts, revise and cancel them
- · Receive alerts in subjects of interest
- · Alerts sent weekly via e-mail
