## **Community-Based Job Training Grants**

**Challenge**: The four county-area in south central Georgia (Colquitt, Tift, Turner, and Worth) has had consistently high unemployment and the residents face a number of employment barriers. Advanced manufacturing and healthcare employers have reported the need for soft skills training, on-site technical skills training, and cross-training for current and new employees.

Addressing the Challenge: The South Georgia Community-Based Job Training Consortium plans to use Moultrie Technical College's existing Remote Automated Management Program (RAMP) to provide training to current workers, dislocated workers, high school students and disadvantaged African-American youth in four counties. The consortium plans to establish seven RAMP systems on-site at high schools in each county; at the Heatcraft Refrigeration Products manufacturing plant in Tifton; at the Tift Regional Medical Center; and at the Tifton One-Stop Center. Moultrie Technical College will provide soft skills training, diplomas or certificates in advanced manufacturing and healthcare, and provide a coordinated system for the region's workforce and its educators.

## **Projected Outcomes:**

- 750 participants will be served by the program.
- 87 percent of the total number of participants will enter employment.
- 90 percent of participants that entered employment will be retained.
- Average yearly earnings of \$31,000 for the participants entering job-related employment.
