



**STATEMENT OF INTENT  
FOR  
FEDERAL AGENCIES  
TO PURCHASE RENEWABLE RESOURCES**

- I. Acquisition of renewable resources promises to achieve environmental benefits such as decreased air pollution from fossil-fueled power plants, increase national security by lessening U.S. dependence on imported energy, manage exposure to rising or volatile energy prices and support local economic development.
- II. Federal agencies can play a significant role in building a market for clean renewable energy technologies, particularly when renewable resource needs are aggregated and economies of scale can be captured.
- III. Federal agencies can meet the Energy Policy Act of 2005, Section 203 and Executive Order 13423 renewable goals through this commitment.

\_\_\_\_\_ agrees, by and through its authorized representative executing this Statement of Intent, that 1) it will make every effort to contract for the renewable resources requested above through an Interagency Agreement (IA) with Western; 2) adequate appropriations are available for the current fiscal year; and 3) every effort will be made to secure future appropriations. After sufficient statements of intent have been signed, Western intends to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP). The IA is required before the RFP is issued, and will include an Economy Act Determination and Finding (D&F). Resulting bids will be reviewed, and if deemed acceptable, Western intends to sign a contract(s) with the renewable energy provider(s) based on the statements of intent and IAs. Western will charge the Federal agency for the administrative costs of developing, negotiating and executing contracts and IAs, as well as an annual administrative charge. These costs may be partially covered by Federal Energy Management Program (FEMP) funds, if available.
