



Accessibility



Grand Teton National Park and the John D. Rockefeller, Jr., Memorial Parkway offer a variety of accessible facilities. This handout provides an overview of accessible facilities. Please contact a visitor center or concession staff for additional information.

Access Pass

The Access Pass is a lifetime pass for U.S. citizens or permanent residents with permanent disabilities. Documentation is required to obtain the pass. Acceptable documentation includes: statement by a licensed physician; document issued by a Federal agency such as the Veteran's Administration, Social Security Disability Income or Supplemental Security Income; or document issued by a State agency such as a vocational rehabilitation agency. The pass provides access to, and use of, Federal recreation sites that charge an Entrance or Standard Amenity Fee. The pass admits the passholder and passengers in a non-commercial vehicle at per vehicle fee areas

and passholder plus three adults, not to exceed four adults, at per person fee areas (children under 16 are admitted free). **The pass can only be obtained in person at the park.** The Access Pass provides a 50 percent discount on some Expanded Amenity Fees charged for facilities and services such as camping, swimming, boat launching, and specialized interpretive services. In some cases where Expanded Amenity Fees are charged, only the passholder will be given the 50 percent price reduction. The pass is non-transferable and generally does NOT cover or reduce special recreation permit fees or fees charged by concessioners.

Concession Facilities

Many services within the park including food, lodging and activities can accommodate people with differing abilities. In some cases facilities are Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant, in other cases concessioners will work with individuals to provide access when possible. Jackson Lake Lodge

The lodge features 20 fully accessible guest rooms. Parking, registration, main lobby, decks and restrooms are fully accessible. A portable strobe and a TDD kit are available in the reservation office. Two restaurants, the Mural Room and the Blue Heron Lounge are wheelchair accessible. The Pioneer Grill is not accessible but its menu is available in the Mural Room for patrons with disabilities.

Jenny Lake Lodge

This facility has two accessible guest rooms (without roll-in showers). The lobby, registration area, restaurant and restrooms are fully accessible.

Colter Bay Village

The Colter Bay Village cabins have two fully accessible units, in addition to the store, laundromat, marina, restaurant and cabin office.

Flagg Ranch

Flagg Ranch has one fully accessible room and three partially accessible rooms.

Signal Mountain Lodge

The convenience store, gift shop, restaurant and registration building are wheelchair compliant. Six cabins have no stairs but the cabins' interiors are not ADA compliant.

Leek's Marina

The restaurant and bathroom are accessible.

Triangle X Ranch

There is one fully ADA accessible cabin with a ramp. The main house has a ramp, and a wheelchair accessible public bathroom is located in a separate building.

Jenny Lake Boating

The east-side dock and bridge are wheelchair accessible. Shuttle boats are ADA compliant. The west-side dock is not accessible.

Activities

Although none of the concessioners offering activities such as river trips, horseback riding, and mountain climbing are ADA compliant, concessioners will work with interested visitors to try to make necessary accommodations.

Suggested Trails

Hiking trails in Grand Teton National Park offer varying degrees of difficulty and challenge. Any type of assistive technology is allowed within the park.

Colter Bay: A path follows the eastern shore of Jackson Lake for 1/3 of a mile beginning at the marina. Access through the amphitheater north of the visitor center.

Jackson Lake Dam: The overlook trail at the southwest end of the dam offers tremendous views of Jackson Lake and the Teton Range.

Laurance S. Rockefeller Preserve: A path leads from the parking area to the preserve center and on to an overlook of the creek and waterfall.

Menors Ferry Historic District: A network of paths winds through the area, providing limited access to facilities.

Multi-use Pathway: A wide, paved pathway travels from Dornan's to South Jenny Lake parallel to the Teton Park Road.

South Jenny Lake: Wide, paved paths with gentle slopes lead to the lakeshore; lined with stone retaining walls and built in benches, forming a 3/4 mile loop.

String Lake: A moderately rough trail with rustic log benches along the eastern shore with interpretive signs describing the formation of glacial lakes.
