14. RESPONSES TO TECHNICAL QUESTIONS

- 1. Because we are required to use an electronic system, our Control Form (which tracks all of the required information) must also be generated electronically, correct?
- **a.** The purpose of the electronic system is so the centers can request test and receive results. I can not comment on your control form.
- 2. Should we expect to continue to transport specimen 5 days per week from each of the 125 sites the way it is done now?
- a. Centers can send specimens Monday thru Friday, therefore specimens could arrive on Saturday.
- 3. Will you reimburse us our cost of the equipment needed for the electronic system that will be installed at each site? This may include the computer, printer and label printer.
- a. No
- 4. What is the unit price the current contractor is charging?
- a. \$8.95 for screening and \$0 for confirmation
- 5. Will you reimburse us our cost to go to each site to install the needed equipment?
