## SECOND UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO MOVE TO QUASH SUBPOENA

Samsung Semiconductor Inc. ("Samsung"), a non-party to the above-captioned case, through undersigned counsel, files this second motion for a brief extension of time for Samsung to file a motion to quash Rambus Incorporated's Subpoena Duces Tecum, dated August 20, 2002 (the "Subpoena").

Rambus Incorporated ("Rambus") served Samsung with the Subpoena on October 1, 2002. Under the applicable procedures, the time to file a motion to quash the Subpoena would have been October 11, 2002. Samsung filed its Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to Move to Quash Subpoena on October 11, 2002 seeking three (3) additional days to further negotiate with opposing counsel concerning the scope of the Subpoena. October 14, 2002 was a Federal holiday. Therefore, pursuant to Federal Trade Commission Rules of Practice § 4.3(a), the present deadline for Samsung to file a motion to quash the Subpoena is October 15, 2002.

On October 11, 2002, counsel for Samsung and Rambus telephonically conferred in an attempt to resolve Samsung's complaints about the scope and burden of the Subpoena and other issues regarding the Subpoena. At the conclusion of the call, Rambus agreed to withdraw and/or

revise and timely resubmit certain broadly drafted document requests. Additionally, Samsung agreed to make a good faith effort to produce documents to Rambus' more narrowly tailored document requests and provide an initial privilege log by October 23, 2002.

Samsung and Rambus have agreed to further extend the time for Samsung to file a motion to quash the Subpoena to October 31, 2002. The extension is not sought for delay, but only to allow for the resolution of this discovery dispute without litigation (if possible).

Counsel for the Federal Trade Commission do not oppose this extension.

Accordingly, Samsung requests that this motion be granted and that it be given until October 31, 2002 to file a motion to quash the Subpoena, without prejudice to seek a further extension of this deadline.
