Subpoena to Micron Technology, Inc. in the *Matter of Rambus, Inc.*, before the Federal Trade Commission File No. Docket No. 9302

Dear Mr. Rosen:

I am writing to follow up on my October 29, 2002 letter on issues relating to DRAM chip pricing. As you know, Micron has taken the position that issues relating to DRAM pricing are irrelevant to the issues raised in the FTC proceeding against Rambus. I wanted to bring to your attention two additional facts: (1) Micron produced documents relating to the FTC relating to DRAM chip pricing shortly before the FTC filed its complaint; and (2) the FTC has served the following request upon Rambus: ,

"All documents relating to any analysis of DRAM supply, demand, or prices, or projections of DRAM supply, demand, or prices".

It appears that the FTC and Micron view DRAM pricing as relevant to this proceeding. I note in addition that the FTC has stated publicly that Rambus' licensing efforts have resulted in additional costs to consumers, which necessarily means that those efforts have had some purported impact on DRAM pricing. I'm sure you can understand why Rambus would nned to take discovery regarding the factors that have impacted DRAM prices.

We do appreciate your burdensomeness objections. WE have, therefore, come up with an additional proposal that would eliminate the need to produce detailed records of

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transactions. We propose instead that Micron produce the following: 1) All documents analyzing, reflecting, or describing the factors that influenced your DRAM pricing decisions between January 1, 1998 and June 18, 2002; 2) All documents that reflect or refer to communications with any other DRAM manufacturer about DRAM pricing; and 3) All documents that the company has provided to or received from the Department of Justice ("DOJ"), any grand jury, or any other person in connection with the DOJ's investigation of alleged price-fixing by certain DRAM chip manufacturers.

Please let me know if we are going to be able to reach an understanding on this issue, or if we will be forced to seek to compel your response.
