
David R. Thomas Director Office Of Congressional Relations Federal Trade Commission

David R. Thomas has served as the Director of the Federal Trade Commission's Office of Congressional Relations since February 2000. In this position, Mr. Thomas serves as the FTC's chief liaison to Congress



and is responsible for coordinating the FTC's interactions with Capitol Hill. He promotes FTC policy initiatives in Congress; negotiates with Congressional staff on legislation concerning the FTC, consumer issues, and general antitrust matters; and oversees the FTC's budget in the annual appropriations process. He also coordinates the FTC's involvement in Congressional hearings, advising those testifying on the Commission's behalf, and briefing Members of Congress and key Congressional staff on Commission activities.

Prior to joining the Commission, Mr. Thomas served as the Deputy Director of Legislative Affairs to Vice President Al Gore for two years. Mr. Thomas served as a senior advisor to the Vice President, and was one of his top liaisons to Capitol Hill.

Mr. Thomas received his undergraduate degree from Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee.
