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Statewide Evaluation Activities

“GOLD STANDARD” CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM



In January 2008, Ohio implemented the One-Stop System Certification and Quality Assurance Initiative. Named the “Gold Standard” Continuous Improvement Program, it is designed to examine the quality assurance and continuous improvement efforts within the state’s 30 full-service, local One-Stop Systems. The program provides a consistent standard for Ohio’s local workforce investment areas to measure the quality and delivery of business and job seeker services, accessibility of services, and the effectiveness of One-Stop management. The goal of the quality assurance process is to encourage continuous improvement as a regular activity of the One-Stop System and to certify each system.

Within Ohio, the ODJFS Office of Workforce Development manages the “Gold Standard” Continuous Improvement Program and, in coordination with state and local stakeholders, has developed 12 benchmarks of excellence for One-Stop System quality assurance and certification. The benchmarks are captured within three categories as follows:

Business Services

- Active business community involvement in the local Workforce Investment Board and One-Stop System decision making process.
- Repeat use of One-Stop services by employers and continuous newly recruited employers utilizing the services of the One-Stop System.
- Economic development representation and

involvement in the local workforce area Business Plan and other workforce development activities.

Job Seeker Services

- The One-Stop System offers a breadth of services to job seeking individuals that meet locally defined self sufficiency levels.
- Barrier removal is an integral strategy to the overall customer flow of services.
- Customer satisfaction is consistently high.

One-Stop System Management

- Diverse public and private sector funding supports the One-Stop System.
- Partner integration is evident through non-duplication of services and efficient and effective service delivery.
- Outreach activities are strategically planned and effective.
- Staff competency is a high priority.
- All partners involved in the One-Stop System Memorandum of Understanding are attaining performance measures.
- Decision making is data and demand driven using appropriate scorecards and metrics.

Ohio’s “Gold Standard” process utilizes several diagnostic tools and survey instruments to collect One-Stop information including an on-line business survey, partner self-assessments designed on the Malcolm Baldrige Criteria for Performance Excellence, on-site observations, desk reviews, and mystery shopping. Continuous improvement and achievement results at the local level will be captured using a balanced scorecard and provided periodically to the WIBs. As this is an on-going evaluation of the One-Stop System, at the minimum, Ohio’s “Gold Standard” is expected to continue through June 2010.

Program Year 2007 Cost Effectiveness Analysis

In PY 2007, Ohio served 39,989 participants at an average cost of \$3,253. As shown below, the state expended \$130,098,063 on core, intensive, and training services for the three WIA population groups. This amount includes local administrative and obligatory expenses for participants in WIA Programs, but does not include rapid response or statewide 15% expenditures.

Of the participants served, 19,712 received training services at an average cost per participant of \$6,600.

When compared to PY 2006, this represents a significant increase in training services.

For the year, Ohio expended an average cost of \$2,165 per adult, \$4,634 per dislocated worker, and \$3,908 per youth participant. This investment in WIA does not reflect the substantial returns to the state from earnings, public assistance and unemployment insurance savings, and increased tax revenue that will result from exiters who enter employment.
