Why Engage the Public?

- Reduces conflict and identifies common ground positions
- Creates constituency and momentum for political action
- Improves outcomes by taking into account public wisdom and perspectives of those most directly impacted
- Increases trust in decision makers and educates the public

- Where are we in the policy development process?
- Where are we in the political process?

- What is the state of the public's knowledge?
