Applicants for inclusion on the Court's list of attorneys eligible for CJA appointments should be committed to providing timely and effective representation and must establish that they have sufficient qualifications to meet the requirements imposed by this Court through its rules and case law. Applicants also should be committed to improving and maintaining their advocacy and brief writing skills. - A. Membership in good standing in the D.C. Bar.
- B. Office within the metropolitan D.C. area
- C. Commitment to remain on the CJA appointments list for a minimum of two years.
- D. Commitment to complete the yearly CLE requirement and update the application yearly with new information. See Miscellaneous Order No. M-217-03.
- E. Completion of the attached questionnaire. If a question does not apply, please so state. You must submit four (4) copies of your application and writing sample.
- F. Execution of release and waiver of confidentiality to permit the Office of Bar Counsel to release information on disciplinary records to the D.C. Court of Appeals.
