It contains descriptive statistical information, using tables and charts, about many aspects of the Executive Branch workforce. **Note that data for the U.S. Postal Service are excluded from all tables except those on pages 8 and 64, and the tables in Part 4.** Both historical and current data are displayed, resulting in a comprehensive snapshot of the Federal worker -- personal and professional characteristics, employment levels, and benefit payments and contributions. The statistical tables and charts in *THE FACT BOOK* are based on data from a wide range of sources, each of which is cited on the appropriate page with telephone contacts and email addresses if available.





The "Typical" Federal Civilian Employee, 1998






The "Typical" Federal Civilian Employee, 1998



Rank by Salary*





Average Adjusted Basic Salaries and Full-Time Employment by State (10 Highest Only)



















Race/National Origin Average Salary by White-Collar Occupational Category (PATCO)*



Employment of Women by Occupational Category


























Allocated vs Appointed




Senior Executive Service: Awards 1988 - 1998












Retirement System On Annuity Roll at End of Fiscal Year
















