

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING
ORDER FREEZING ASSETS
AND PROVIDING ADDITIONAL
EQUITABLE RELIEF

Plaintiff, the Federal Trade Commission ("Commission") having filed its complaint for a permanent injunction and other equitable relief in this matter pursuant to section 13(b) of the Federal Trade Commission Act ("FTC"), 15 U.S.C. § 53(b), and having moved ex parte for a temporary restraining order and for an order to show cause why a preliminary injunction should not be



granted pursuant to Rule 65(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Fed. R. Civ. P. 65, and the Court, having considered the complaint, declarations, exhibits, and memorandum of law filed in support thereof, finds that:

- 1. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case, and there is good cause to believe it will have jurisdiction over all parties hereto;
- 2. There is good cause to believe that the Defendant, Jeremy Martinez, has engaged and is likely to engage in acts and practices that violate Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a), and that the Plaintiff is therefore likely to prevail on the merits of this action;
- irreparable damage to the Court's ability to grant effective final relief will occur from the sale, transfer, or other disposition or concealment by the Defendant of his assets or business records unless the Defendant is immediately restrained and enjoined by Order of this Court. The evidence set forth in the Commission's Memorandum of Points and Authorities in Support of its Ex Parte Application for a TRO ("Memorandum"), and in the accompanying declarations and exhibit, shows that the Defendant has engaged in a concerted course of illegal activity in connection with the sale of false identification templates on the Internet designed and marketed to be used for fraudulent purposes, in violation of Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. 45(a). Defendants very business facilitates the alteration and

concealment of identity. Thus, there is good cause to believe that the Defendant will attempt to conceal the scope of his deliberate illegal actions to avoid returning his ill-gotten gains to consumers injured by his unlawful practices if not restrained from doing so by Order of this Court.

- 4. The Commission has not provided notice to the Defendant due to the likelihood that advance notice of this action will lead to the very irreparable injury the Commission seeks to prevent through its motion for an exparte TRO, including dissipation or concealment of assets and destruction of evidence. The Commission's request for this emergency exparte relief is not the result of any lack of diligence on the Commission's part, but is instead based upon the nature of the Defendant's unlawful conduct.
- 5. Weighing the equities and considering the Plaintiff's likelihood of ultimate success, a temporary restraining order with asset freeze and other equitable relief is in the public interest; and
- 6. Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(c) does not require security of the United States or an officer or agency thereof.

Definitions

For the purpose of this temporary restraining order, the following definitions shall apply:

A. "Defendant" means Jeremy Martinez, individually and d/b/a Info World, as well as his assigns, agents, servants,

employees, or affiliates, and those persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any entity, corporation, subsidiary, division, or other device, unless specified otherwise.

- in, right to, or claim to any real or equitable interest in, right to, or claim to any real or personal property of any Defendant, or held for the benefit of any Defendant, including, but not limited to "goods," "instruments," "equipment," "fixtures," "general intangibles," "inventory," "checks," or "notes" (as these terms are defined in the Uniform Commercial Code), and all chattels, leaseholds, contracts, mails or other deliveries, shares of stock, lists of consumers, accounts, credits, receivables and cash, wherever located.
- or under the authority of the United States Government, a State, political subdivision of a State, a foreign government, political subdivision of a foreign government, an international governmental or international quasi governmental organization which, when completed with information concerning a particular individual, is of a type intended or commonly accepted for the purposed of identification of individuals, including but not limited to, driver's licenses, birth certificates, social security

- D. "False identification document" means any document that could reasonably be confused with an identification document.
- E. "Identification template" means any implement, impression, electronic device or computer hardware or software that is specifically configured or primarily used for making an identification document, false identification document or other identification template.

CONDUCT PROHIBITIONS

I.

INJUNCTION AGAINST PROVIDING FALSE IDENTIFICATION

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Defendant is hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from engaging, participating or assisting in any manner or capacity whatsoever, directly, or in concert with others, individually or through any business entity or other device, in the sale, advertisement, promotion, marketing, offering, or provision of any false identification or identification template, or any information, product, or service related thereto.

INJUNCTION AGAINST PROVIDING OTHERS WITH THE MEANS AND INSTRUMENTALITIES TO VIOLATE SECTION 5 OF THE FTC ACT

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in connection with the offering for sale or sale of identification documents, false identification documents, or identification templates, Defendant is hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from providing to others the means and instrumentalities with which to make, expressly or by implication, orally or in writing, any false or misleading statement or representation of material fact, including, but not limited to representations that: conceal or alter any person's actual identity; and

- indicate that a identification document was issued by a government agency.

III.

ASSET FREEZE

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendant is temporarily restrained and enjoined from:

Transferring, converting, encumbering, selling, concealing, dissipating, disbursing, assigning, spending, withdrawing, perfecting a security interest in, or otherwise disposing of any assets, including, but not limited to, funds, property, accounts, contracts, shares of stock, lists of consumer names, or other assets, wherever located, including outside

the United States, that are (1) owned or controlled, directly or indirectly, by the Defendant, in whole or in part; (2) in the actual or constructive possession of the Defendant; or (3) owned, controlled by, or in the actual or constructive possession of any corporation, partnership, or other entity directly or indirectly owned, managed, or controlled by the Defendant, including but not limited to, any assets held by, for, or under the name of the Defendant at any bank or savings and loan institution, or with any broker-dealer, escrow agent, title company, commodity trading company, precious metal dealer, or other financial institution or depository of any kind;

- B. Opening or causing to be opened any safe deposit box titled in the name of the Defendant, or subject to access by the Defendant; and
- C. Incurring charges or cash advances on any credit card, charge card, or debit card issued in the name, singly or jointly, of the Defendant.

IV.

REPATRIATION OF ASSETS AND DOCUMENTS LOCATED IN FOREIGN COUNTRIES

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendant, whether acting through any trust, corporation, subsidiary, division, or other device, shall:

A. Within three (3) business days following service of this

- B. Within three (3) business days following service of this Order, provide the Plaintiff with a full accounting of all documents and assets that are located outside of the territory of the United States of America and are held by or for the Defendant or are under the Defendant's direct or indirect control, jointly, severally, or individually; and
- C. Hold and retain all transferred documents and assets and prevent any transfer, disposition, or dissipation whatsoever of any such assets or funds; and
- D. Provide the Plaintiff access to the Defendant's records and documents held by financial institutions outside the territorial United States, by signing the Consent to Release of Financial Records attached hereto as Attachment A.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that not less than three (3) days prior to the scheduled date and time for the hearing on a preliminary injunction in this matter, but in no event later than ten (10) days after entry of this Order, the Defendant shall provide

the Commission with a completed financial statement, on the form attached to this Order as Attachment B.

VI.

CONSUMER CREDIT REPORTS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Section 604(1) of the Fair Credit Reporting Act, 15 U.S.C. § 1681b(1), any consumer reporting agency may furnish a consumer report concerning the Defendant to the Commission.

VII.

PLAINTIFF'S ACCESS TO LUSINESS RECORDS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Defendant shall allow the Plaintiff's representatives, agents, and assistants immediate access to all of the Defendant's business premises to inspect and copy documents so the Commission may prepare for the preliminary injunction hearing and identify and locate assets. The Plaintiff shall have discretion to regulate the time, place, and manner of such access consistent with this purpose. The Commission may remove materials from the Defendant's business premises so they may be inspected, inventoried, and copied.

If any business records or property relating to the Defendant's sale of false identification documents are located in the personal residence of the Defendant, then Defendant shall, within twenty four (24) hours of service of this Order:

Produce to the Plaintiff for inspection, inventory and/or copying, at a location designated by the Plaintiff, all materials related or referring, directly or indirectly, to the Defendant's offer, sale or provision of false identification templates, and/or any materials, information, products or data related thereto, including, but not limited to, identification templates, false identification documents, computers, computerized files, storage media (including but not limited to floppy disks, hard drives, cd-roms, zip disks, punch cards, magnetic tape, backup tapes and computer chips) on which information has been saved, any and all equipment needed to read any such material, contracts, accounting data, correspondence (including, but not limited to, electronic correspondence), advertisements (including, but not limited to, advertisements placed on the World Wide Web), USENET Newsgroup postings, World Wide Web pages, books, written or printed records, handwritten notes, telephone logs, telephone scripts, receipt books, ledgers, personal and business canceled checks and check registers, bank statements, appointment books, copies of federal, state or local business or personal income or property tax returns, 1099 forms, and other documents or records of any kind that relate to Defendant's business practices; and

B. Produce to the Plaintiff for inspection, inventory and/or copying, at a location designated by the Plaintiff, all computers and data in whatever form, used by the Defendant, in whole or in part, relating to the Defendant's business practices.

The Commission shall return materials so removed, or produced by the Defendant, within three (3) business days of completing said inventory and copying.

VIII.

PRESERVATION OF RECORDS

restrained and enjoined from destroying, erasing, mutilating, concealing, altering, transferring, or otherwise disposing of, in any manner, directly or indirectly, any identification templates, false identification documents, computers, computerized files, storage media (including but not limited to floppy disks, hard drives, cd-roms, zip disks, punch cards, magnetic tape, backup tapes and computer chips) on which information has been saved, any and all equipment needed to read any such material, contracts, accounting data, correspondence (including, but not limited to, electronic correspondence), advertisements (including, but not limited to, advertisements placed on the World Wide Web), USENET Newsgroup postings, World Wide Web pages, books, written or printed records, handwritten notes, telephone logs, telephone scripts, receipt books, ledgers, personal and

business canceled checks and check registers, bank statements, appointment books, copies of federal, state or local business or personal income or property tax returns, 1099 forms, and other documents or records of any kind that relate to the business practices or business or personal finances of the Defendant.

IX.

MAINTENANCE OF CURRENT BUSINESS RECORDS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Defendant is hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from:

- A. Failing to create and maintain documents that, in reasonable detail, accuratel, fairly, and completely reflect the Defendant's incomes, disbursements, transactions, and use of money; and
- B. Creating, operating, or exercising any control over any business entity, including any partnership, limited partnership, joint venture, sole proprietorship or corporation, without first providing the Commission with a written statement disclosing: (1) the name of the business entity; (2) the address and telephone number of the business entity; (3) the names of the business entity's officers, directors, principals, managers and employees; and (4) a detailed description of the business entity's intended activities.

RETENTION OF ASSETS AND RECORDS BY FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pending determination of the Plaintiff's request for a preliminary injunction, any financial or brokerage institution, business entity, or person served with a copy of this Order that holds, controls or maintains custody of any account or asset of the Defendant, or has held, controlled or maintained custody of any such account or asset at any time since the date of entry of this Order shall

- A. Hold and retain within its control and prohibit the withdrawal, removal, assignment, transfer, pledge, encumbrance, disbursement, dissipation, conversion, sale, or other disposal of any such asset except by further order of the Court;
- B. Deny the Defendants access to any safe deposit box that is:
 - titled in his name, individually or jointly; or
 - otherwise subject to access by the Defendant;
- C. Provide the Commission's counsel, within five (5) business days of receiving a copy of this Order, a sworn statement setting forth:
 - the identification number of each such account or asset titled in the name, individually or jointly, of the Defendant, or held on behalf of, or for the benefit of the Defendant;
 - 2. the balance of each such account, or a description

of the nature and value of such asset as of the close of business on the day on which this Order is served, and, if the account or other asset has been closed or removed, the date closed or removed, the total funds removed in order to close the account, and the name of the person or entity to whom such account or other asset was remitted; and

- 3. the identification of any safe deposit box that is titled in the name, individually or jointly, of the Defendant, or is otherwise subject to access by the Defendant; and
- D. Upon the request by the Commission, promptly provide the Commission with copies of all records or other documentation pertaining to each such account or asset, including but not limited to originals or copies of account applications, account statements, signature cards, checks, drafts, deposit tickets, transfers to and from the accounts, all other debit and credit instruments or slips, currency transaction reports, 1099 forms, and safe deposit box logs. Any such financial institution, account custodian, or other aforementioned entity may arrange for the Commission to obtain copies of any such records which the Commission seeks.

NOTIFICATION PROVISIONS

XI.

DISTRIBUTION OF ORDER BY DEFENDANT

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Defendant shall immediately provide a copy of this Order to each of his affiliates, subsidiaries, divisions, sales entities, successors, assigns, officers, directors, employees, independent contractors, agents, attorneys, and representatives; and shall, within ten (10) days from the date of entry of this Order, provide the Commission with a sworn statement that he has complied with this provision of the Order, which statement shall include the names and addresses of each such person or entity who received a copy of the Order.

XII.

SERVICE OF ORDER

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that copies of this Order may be served by any means, including facsimile transmission, upon any financial institution or other entity or person that may have possession, custody, or control of any documents or assets of the Defendant, or that may be subject to any provision of this Order. Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(c)(2), this Order and the initial papers filed in this matter may be served on the Defendant by any law enforcement officer, by any agent of the Plaintiff, or by any agent of any process service retained by the Plaintiff.

XIII.

SERVICE OF PLEADINGS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties shall serve all memoranda, affidavits and other evidence on which they intend to rely at the preliminary injunction hearing set in this matter not later than 4:00 p.m. (EST) of the second day prior to the hearing date. Service on the Commission shall be performed by delivery to the attention of counsel at the Federal Trade Commission, 600 Pennsylvania Ave., N.W., Room H-238, Washington, DC 20580, and to local counsel at 10877 Wilshire Boulevard, Suite 700, Los Angeles, CA 90024, or by facsimile transmission to (202) 326-3395 and (310)824-4380, or pursuant to any arrangement agreed upon by the parties.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, if any party to this action intends to present the testimony of any witness at the hearing on a preliminary injunction in this matter, that party shall, at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the scheduled date and time of hearing, file with this Court and serve on all other parties a statement disclosing the name, address, and telephone number of any such witness, and either a summary of the witness's expected testimony, or the witness's affidavit or declaration revealing the substance of such witness's expected testimony. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Temporary Restraining Order granted herein shall expire on Promber 5, 2000, at 11:59 P.M., unless within such time the Order, for good cause shown, is extended, or unless the Defendant consents that it should be extended for a longer period of time.

XVI.

PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION HEARING

that Defendant shall appear before this Court on the 15th day of December, 2000 at 3:30 PM o'clock p.m., at the United States Courthouse, Room 5, to show cause, if there is any, why this Court should not enter a preliminary injunction, pending final ruling on the Complaint against the Defendant, enjoining him from further violations of Sections 5(a) and 5(n) of the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a), continuing the

freeze of his assets, and imposing such additional relief as may be appropriate. XVII.
