As people of faith, (members of the Christian Church Disciples of Christ and Disciples Justice Action Network), we are deeply concerned about the impact of unintended pregnancies on women and families. We revere the sanctity of all life and affirm the importance of responsible parenthood. We believe parents must make all possible efforts to ensure that each child is born into a nurturing environment that is prepared to raise the child with love and care.

It is thought that almost one half of annual pregnancies in the United States are accidental. Use of emergency contraception, taken within 72 hours after unprotected sex can substantially help reduce unintended pregnancies and abortions. Emergency contraception DOES NOT cause abortion, rather it prevents pregnancy by inhibiting ovulation, fertilization or implantation. These pills have been used for rape victims in hospitals for almost twenty years.

We urge the FDA to approve Emergency Contraception for over the counter use for American women.

f T he Disciples Justice Action Network (DJAN) was born June 16, 1996, at Park Manor Christian Church in Chicago, an African-American congregation. The 99 persons who attended DJAN's first biennial Campaign for Justice were founding members. In early 1999, membership reached 305, including 35 corporate members, i.e. congregations, regions or other kinds of groups.

DJAN's common life is guided by a Decision Team of twelve persons, elected by mail ballots of the membership. The DT meets four times annually, either face-to-face or by teleconference.

DJAN makes its mission known at Disciples gatherings, including the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ.) It coaches congregations in Initiating justice resolutions for our Assemblies, and sponsors caucuses around the country to discuss such resolutions. It networks with other justice issue organizations to bring to the attention of the Disciples the key moral dilemmas facing us as Christians.

It recruits Disciples seminarians for a social gospel ministry. It publishes a quarterly newsletter, Call to Justice. DJAN is a Open and Affirming network. We invite you and your group to join in its ongoing mission (see response form).
