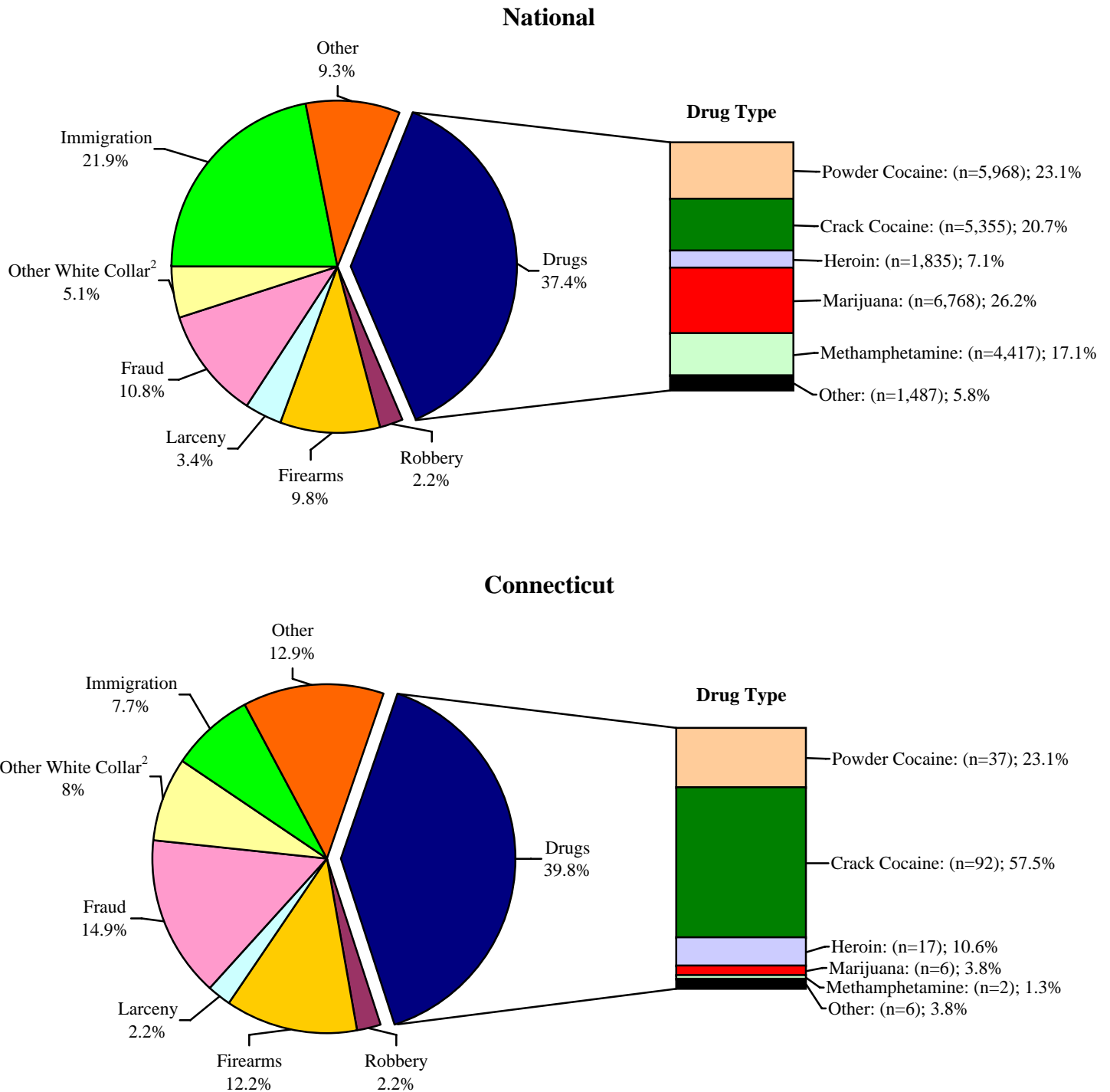

Of the 70,258 guideline cases, 481 cases with no analogous guidelines were excluded from the table. Of the remaining 69,777 cases, 4,606 were excluded due to missing departure information. Districts for which departure information is missing in five percent or more of the cases received included: Southern California (32.3%), Central California (29.6%), Southern Georgia (27.8%), Eastern Virginia (24.4%), Maryland (19.8%), Middle Georgia (16.6%), Western Washington (15.0%), Southern New York (9.9%), Eastern New York (9.5%), Southern Florida (8.8%), Colorado (8.2%), Oregon (7.3%), Northern California (7.2%), Western Kentucky (7.2%), Wyoming (7.0%), Northern New York (6.3%), Utah (5.8%), Northern Georgia (5.7%), Virgin Islands (5.3%), Eastern California (5.2%), and Eastern North Carolina (5.1%).
