Mailing List Etiquette

- Do not set autoresponders and vacation messages to reply to the list ...
 ...or temporarily disable delivery ...
 ...or add "out of the office" or "vacation" to the subject
- Trim replies to display only relevant portions of the original message.
- Keep subject lines simple. Do not change subject line unless topic changes. Digest users must trim messages and modify subject line.
- Limit "me too", "thank you", or other less relevant messages.
- Replies go directly to the list, not to the sender.
- Report abuse or other problems






- Document names should be descriptive.
- Power comes in inter-linking documents.
- To create a document, enter the document name into your browser http://teitac.org/wiki/DOCUMENT NAME ... or create a link to the new document and follow that link.
- Avoid / ? & in document names

Wiki Editing

Simply enter the text you want to display, like you would in a text-only e-mail. WikiText is only required for additional formatting.



WikiText

- ==Headers==
 - Headers provide structure to document and are used to automatically generate table of contents
 - Start with 2nd level header (two ='s)
- Lists
 - * bulleted list
 - # numbered list
- Formatting
 - ``italicized text`` = italicized text
 - ```bold text``` = bold text
 - ````bold and italicized text```` = bold and italicized text
- When editing a document, leave a descriptive summary

- It's difficult to break the wiki (but please don't try).
- Be respectful of the work of others, but wiki is all about change and contribution.
- Wiki is primarily self-governing.
- Plenty of help resources online. Ask for help.
- Don't worry if it's broken let others fix it.
- Identify subcommittee members to be wiki editors.

Subcommittee Meeting Protocols

- Allow two business days advance, public notice. It is your responsibility, NOT the Communications Task Force, to see that notice is given for your meetings.
- Check calendar teitac.org/calendar/ for conflicts.
- Reserve RCC. This is required for each meeting. Tom Brett can assist in reservation.
- Post notice to the wiki (date/time, connection details, RCC ID)
- Request calendar event (form at bottom of calendar page). Include URL of wiki meeting notice page.
- After meeting, post notes and action items to wiki.

During the teleconference...

 - Moderator can add you if you aren't online.
 - Window can be resized.
- Mute yourself if you are not speaking (*2 or Mute in Skype).
- Use a reliable connection. Cell phones are often problematic. Skype only on very fast connections.
- Identify yourself when speaking.
- Speak clearly and at a reasonable speed.
