THE FACT BOOK is produced annually by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) as a convenient reference suitable for a variety of audiences. It contains descriptive statistical information, using tables and charts, about many aspects of the Executive Branch workforce. **Note that data for the U.S. Postal Service are excluded from all tables except those on pages 8 and 64, and the tables in Part 4.** Both historical and current data are displayed, resulting in a comprehensive snapshot of the Federal worker -- personal and professional characteristics, employment levels, and benefit payments and contributions. The statistical tables and charts in *THE FACT BOOK* are based on data from a wide range of sources, each of which is cited on the appropriate page with telephone contacts and email addresses if available.



The "Typical" Federal Civilian Employee, 1999




Average Adjusted Basic Salaries and Full-Time Employment by State




Average Adjusted Basic Salaries and Full-Time Employment by State








Executive Branch Employment 1982 - 1999





Veterans Readjustment Appointments (VRA)









By Gender & Race/National Origin, 1984 - 1999









September 30, 1999





Employment of Women by Occupational Category










Quality Step Increases (QSI's)




Presidential Rank Awards






Performance Awards








Enrollee Category












Retirement System On Annuity Roll at End of Fiscal Year










Federal Employees Group Life Insurance








Participants' Educational Levels and Occupational Groups


