





The "Typical" Federal Civilian Employee, 2000






Average Adjusted Basic Salaries and Full-Time Employment by State




Average Adjusted Basic Salaries and Full-Time Employment by State

















Veterans Readjustment Appointments (VRA)









By Gender & Race/National Origin, 1986 - 2000







Employment of Women by Occupational Category
















Performance Recognition For Non-Senior Executive Service Employees






Allocated vs Appointed






Presidential Rank Awards






Performance Awards






Federal Employee Health Benefits Program Enrollment & Coverage


Enrollee Category






On Annuity Roll at End of Fiscal Year
















