THE FACT BOOK is produced annually by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) as a convenient reference suitable for a variety of audiences. It contains descriptive statistical information, using tables and charts, about many aspects of the Executive Branch workforce. Note that data for the U.S. Postal Service are excluded from all tables except those on pages 8 and 64, and the tables in Part 4. Both historical and current data are displayed, resulting in a comprehensive snapshot of the Federal worker -- personal and professional characteristics, employment levels, and benefit payments and contributions. The statistical tables and charts in THE FACT BOOK are based on data from a wide range of sources, each of which is cited on the appropriate page with telephone contacts and email addresses if available.








The "Typical" Federal Civilian Employee, 2001



Trend In Gender










The "Typical" Federal Civilian Employee, 2001




Pay System


Average Adjusted Basic Salaries and Full-Time Employment by State




Average Adjusted Basic Salaries and Full-Time Employment by State







All Areas, Full-Time Only (1962 - 2001)











Veterans Readjustment Appointments (VRA)









By Gender & Race/National Origin, 1988 - 2001





Employment of Women by Occupational Category












Performance Recognition For Non-Senior Executive Service Employees






Allocated vs Appointed






Presidential Rank Awards






Performance Awards








Enrollee Category






On Annuity Roll at End of Fiscal Year






Operating Revenues and Expenses, Fiscal Year 2001














Participants' Educational Levels and Occupational Groups
