SUBJECT: RELEASE OF POLICY INQUIRY RESPONSE TO SAN BERNARDINO

COUNTY DATED SEPTEMBER 15, 2003 TITLED: CASE OPENING – APPLICATION FOR SERVICES

The Department of Child Support Services (DCSS) recently responded to a policy inquiry from San Bernardino County regarding how legal custody may impact case opening and the establishment of a child support order. Our response has generated a number of questions from various local child support agencies (LCSAs) throughout the State.

As with all policy inquiries submitted, our response specifically addressed the scenario described by San Bernardino County. The policy inquiry included distinct circumstances and details to a specific application for services and case opening situation. As such, the response was drafted with San Bernardino's unique scenario in mind. This response does not necessarily apply to other scenarios covering the same general topic.

However, due to the number of additional questions of the issue of legal custody, DCSS is continuing to examine the issue and will issue a CSS Letter clarifying the original response and policy in the near future. Until such time, LCSAs should continue all program activities as business as usual until the CSS Letter is released.
