SUBJECT: INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR REGISTRY DATA ON CASE WORKER

QUERY TOOL

This letter provides information about Independent Contractor Registry (ICR) data now available on the local child support agency (LCSA) secure website's Case Worker Query Tool (CWQT). In late 2004, Department of Child Support Services (DCSS) began matching obligors in Locate Status on the consortia systems' bi-monthly Federal Case Registry (FCR) submission against the Employment Development Department (EDD) hosted ICR database. The match response data is now available on CWQT.

The ICR data is available through two methods on the CWQT:

- CWQT provides an LCSA-specific report of all responses received for that LCSA.
- Member Search results now include ICR data under the "FCR" tab in the "Other" category.

Based on work with a few ICR pilot LCSAs, DCSS has learned that the ICR data requires manual work by the caseworker prior to issuing a wage assignment, usually a telephone call confirming the obligor is still employed as reported on the ICR. Once confirmation is made, caseworker staff can generate the wage assignment and medical support notice. Consortia systems will <u>not</u> be changed to automatically process ICR matches and issue wage assignments.

LCSAs are hereby notified to discontinue submission of ICR data matching requests to the California Parent Locator Service (CPLS), and instead reference the current data available on CWQT.
