SUBJECT: STATE FISCAL YEAR 2000/01 CHILD SUPPORT
ADMINISTRATIVE ALLOCATIONS

REFERENCE: FSD LETTER 00-02; FSD LETTER 00-13

This letter is to provide counties with the State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2000/01 allocation for administrative costs, exclusive of funds required for Electronic Data Processing (EDP) Maintenance and Operation (M&O) costs. These allocations are based on the planning allocations furnished in FSD Letter 00-13. Adjustments have been made as a result of appeals to the planning allocations and additional funds provided based on premises included in the Budget Act and statewide funding priorities. Separate letters will be sent to each county from the Department of Child Support Services (DCSS) Systems Division to provide individual allocations for funding EDP M&O.

This allocation is based on funds appropriated in the Budget Act of 2000, pursuant to the local agency funding provisions found in Family Code Section 17704. The allocations displayed on Attachment I follow the same format as the SFY 2000/01 planning allocation letter (FSD Letter 00-13). The total allocation is displayed first, and the level of federal funds available from both the normal 66% federal financial participation (FFP) and the estimated federal incentive funds are deducted from the total program cost to arrive at the state General Fund (GF) share. The Budget Act included state GF to back-fill the federal penalties, but counties must have a current signed Annual Automation Cooperation Agreement on file to be eligible for full FFP and avoid pass-through of the penalty.

Please be reminded that this state GF allocation is based on the expectation of receiving \$58.8 million in federal incentive funds as appropriated in the Budget Act. If

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federal incentive funds received by the state decrease as a result of the new federal incentive formula, state GF will be requested to back-fill the decrease. Any additional state GF required for this purpose will be identified in the Governor's Budget released in January 2001.

In SFY 2000/01 Federal incentive funds received by the state will be passed through to counties at a flat 3% rate based on actual reported distributed collections. Counties that experience a decline in federal incentives below the levels estimated in this letter will be reimbursed with state GF as long as their total expenditures are within their total allocation, and contingent on the availability of funds in the statewide appropriation. Unspent funds from other county allocations will be included in the redistribution process at year-end. The control on the GF allocation is necessary to comply with Family Code Section 17704 (b)(1)(B)(i) that prohibits the expenditures from exceeding the amount authorized in the Budget Act.

Attachment II presents the detail contained in the total allocation in Attachment I. Attachment IIA provides a description of the amounts contained in each column of Attachment II.

Counties were informed at the June 7, 2000 IV-D Directors meeting that an appeal of their SFY 2000/01 Administrative Planning Allocation could be submitted. All appeals were reviewed by DCSS staff and adjustments were approved using the same criteria applied to the development of the original allocations. Several counties requested additional funding for customer service and training as part of their appeals. These requests were not funded through the appeal process. Approximately \$25 million is available for a state initiative in this area. State staff will be meeting with members of the IV-D Directors group to receive input toward the development of a distribution methodology. We recognize the importance of releasing this funding to counties as soon as possible. We plan on sharing preliminary information with counties early and finalizing the funding in October.

Local Agency transition costs are not included in this allocation. A transition schedule was released in CSS Letter 00-02 and DCSS staff is working with counties to determine associated costs. Counties will be given additional information and appropriate funding once county transition budgets are submitted and approved.

Funds for Document Imaging Systems are also not included in this allocation. Funding is delayed until further information can be obtained to ensure cost consistency among counties and compatibility with statewide automation efforts.

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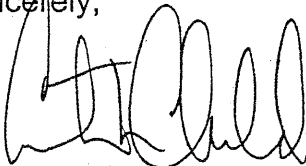

ATTACHMENT IIA

COLUMN 1:

SFY 2000/01 Administrative Planning Allocation transmitted in FSD Letter 00-13.

COLUMN 2:

Approved adjustments resulting from appeals of the Planning Allocation.
Other adjustments, such as, funding requested as EDP but determined to be administrative costs after the release of the Planning Allocation.

COLUMN 3:

Funding for one coordinator per county or consulting services to help in transition planning and preparation efforts at the local level.

Funding for costs associated with the materials, supplies and postage needed to mail the Family Violence Indicator notices to custodial and noncustodial parents to identify victims or potential victims of family violence for those counties implementing in FY 2000/01.

COLUMN 5:

Funding to provide PC and Internet capability to every county. Counties should follow normal EDP approval requirements in using these funds.

COLUMN 6:

Funding to back-fill behind county staff participating in the P3 Project. This represents the funds requested by each county for salaries and benefits of the P3 Project participants.
