Offense Analysis, Number and Percent Change, 2006-2007

- Nationwide in 2007, the average dollar value per motor vehicle stolen was \$6,755. The average dollar value of property taken during burglaries was \$1,991; during robberies, \$1,321; and during larceny-thefts, \$886.
- By location, 43.8 percent of robberies occurred at streets or highways and 67.9 percent of burglaries occurred at residences.
- Of the larceny-theft categories, larceny-thefts from buildings had the highest average dollar value of property taken, \$1,263.
- Nearly 44 percent (43.9) of all larceny-thefts involved property valued at more than \$200.
