♦ OFRD Presentation→LCDR Patrick Denis

- LCDR Denis provided a very informative presentation on the force readiness training lifecycle.
- Handouts of the slides are attached to the minutes.

♦ Immunization Initiative → LCDR Jeff Mouakket

- o Training will be held immediately after the national COA conference on Friday June 8
- o Offering free registration to the first 50 people to sign up
- o Must register for at least one day of the COA conference in order to qualify
- Have secured \$7000 of funding from four different entities (which is being used directly for pharmacist training)
- o Go to the COA conference website to sign up

Non-APhA/OFRD Immunization Training Work Group → LCDR Jeff Mallette

- Currently OFRD only accepts the APhA training certification
- Need to develop method to recognize other training programs
- o Developed four main criteria from the learning objectives of the APhA program:
 - Didactic training
 - Formulation of immunization plans for patients
 - Skills for vaccine administration technique via hands on training
 - Written test on immunization knowledge and practice test on technique (done on live subject)

♦ Readiness → CDR Mark Strong

- o Working on Readiness WIPT (7 different CCI's being updated)
- o Major proposed changes
 - Weight and body fat standards shift to evaluate BMI (must be no greater than 27.5)
 - Disciplinary process delay by one cycle go to letter of reproval first (instead of directly to letter of reprimand)
 - Streamline process for submitting immunizations so officers only have to send them to one place

- Sent proposed changes to PAC members for comments
- Probably will be issued in May or June

♦ Mentoring Program → CAPT Lillie Golson

- o Currently working on the February calls to active duty (all others are caught up)
- There were six new calls to active duty in February (1 FDA; 3 IHS; 1 CMS; 1 NIH)
- o Appreciate efforts of officers who have volunteered to serve as mentors
- Need more volunteers from IHS (especially Alaska) CAPT Bresette will send request for volunteers through IHS pharmacist listserv
- o Evaluations are coming in; mentors are submitting their checklists

♦ Pharmacy Coin Project→ CDR Laura Pincock

- O Work group has been meeting for a month and a half to design a coin
- o Sent draft designs via pharmacist listserv
- One side to represent the Corps and one side to represent the pharmacy category
- o Recommend circular coin, perhaps 2" size
- o Looking for input from the PAC on the draft designs
- Planning to investigate engraving the OPDIVs where pharmacists work along the outer edge of the coin
- o Plan to come up with a design then contact several companies to negotiate the best price
- Generally the actual cost is \$3-\$4 per coin need to decide if this be a fundraising effort or if we will provide the coins at cost?
- o Possibly talking to COF and asking them to fund the coins
- Would like to have coins ordered in April so they will be available in June for the COA conference
- Points of discussion from PAC:
 - Consideration of using the Bowl of Hygea

- Consideration of using the international green cross representing pharmacy
- Issues that increase the cost: depends on manufacturer; adding different metals; special engraving
- Most people seem to like designs 1 and 4

◆ Last meeting was February 9 – met with the Acting Surgeon General who answered questions from various junior officers; recognized need for others to know who we are and what we do;

- encouraged officers to go back and recruit at their professional schools, as well as civilian colleagues; emphasized Corps values; talked about the push to move through the Awards backlog
- Next meeting is April 5; call in information will be available on the JOAG website

Agency Reports

- ♦ Ex-Minimus Agencies CDR Chris Allen provided a report from CDC
 - Recently held a pandemic flu exercise to look at processes and plans in place for a pandemic; this was internal for CDC; 300 staff members were involved including 4 pharmacists; another exercise is scheduled in April and this will be external
 - o Updated response plan was released after the internal exercise; it includes different recommendations for states and communities (www.pandemicflu.gov)
 - Three pharmacists visited the Mercer school of Pharmacy for career day; four agencies were represented in terms of experience; students expressed lots of interest in IHS and COSTEP program
 - Two CDC pharmacists have committed to staff the APhA booth (it is not necessary to register for the meeting to staff the booth)
 - o LCDR Yon Yu was appointed as an official delegate for the APhA meeting
- ♦ National Institutes of Health (NIH) CDR Richard DeCederfelt
 - O Continue to work on development of inpatient pharmacy information system; in future plan to implement outpatient system
 - o Construction of new facility; completion projected for Summer 2008
 - CE opportunity: Pharmacotherapy Frontiers; scheduled for April 21; 8am-12:30pm (provides 4 hours of CE); registration opens on March 31 (www.cc.nih.gov/phar); will send information over the listsery
 - o Pharmacy chief is resigning effective March 2, 2007
- ♦ DHS LCDR Patrick Romero (USCG)
 - o There is a USCG position available in Alameda, CA
 - o Positive response from officers regarding PAC meeting recordings
 - o Pharmacy category coin most officers liked designs 1 and 4
 - CAPT Vernon Lew will have USCG pharmacy challenge coins available at the APhA meeting

 - Office of Regulatory Affairs is undergoing transformation; proposed to close 7 of 13 laboratories in FY08
