CDR Sood called the April 2007 Pharmacist Professional Advisory Committee (PharmPAC) meeting to order.

Minutes from the March 1, 2007 PharmPAC meeting were accepted as amended.

CPO Comments: CDR Nita Sood for RADM Robert Pittman

♦ New PHS Recruitment Call Center

- o Will go live on Monday April 9, 2007
- o Can be accessed through the current 800 number (1-800-279-1605)
- o Will direct applicants to the newly revised website at www.usphs.gov
- Starting in May or June the system will be enhanced to push calls out to the associate recruiter category leads

♦ Extension beyond 30 years

- o New policy includes a new pay table with pay increases at 28 and 30 years and additional retirement pay percentages beyond 30 years
- O Does not guarantee that officers will be extended beyond 30 years, but if they are new pay and retirement will apply
- o Information is available at the OCCO website (http://dcp.psc.gov/eccis/documents/ppm07 004.pdf)

♦ Field Medical Readiness Badge (FMRB)

- o Now awarded quarterly to officers who meet the award qualifications
- o No application or paperwork is needed from officers
- o Total of 347 officers met the criteria in March
- More information to come from OFRD

♦ Uniforms

- o DHHS has decided to link the PHS uniforms with those of the Navy
- Uniform WIPT has been formed to work on this project
- o WIPT is expected to provide recommendations to the ASH within 30 days
- Requested PAC feedback LCDR Andrei Nabakowski is gathering information on behalf of the PharmPAC

♦ Basic Officers Training Course

- o OCCO is piloting an officer basic course for 30 new officers this summer
- This is the course they hope to have all new officers attend when called to active duty
- o Will include what is currently included in BOTC and OFRD basic requirements

- o Pharmacy students are a source of future pharmacists
- o Communicating PHS opportunities: PLANT profiles, Pharmacy's Best Kept Secret Slideshow, and COSTEP information are available on PharmPAC website
- o Want to provide links from pharmacy school websites to PharmPAC website
- o In 2001, checked all school websites and found that none of them linked to the PharmPAC website; a letter was sent to all pharmacy school deans resulting in 26 links
- o Recently checked and only 1 school is still linked to the PharmPAC website
- Sent letters signed by RADM Pittman; 14 schools have linked back to us; have seen an increased number of hits on the student section
- o CDR Sood commented that the PAC needs to look at doing more with the student listserv

♦ Student Programs→CDR Mary Kremzner

- o Encouraging pharmacists to participate in the APhA Career Survey; ends April 30; as of March 21 there were 43 respondents indicating government service
- COSTEP working on contacting applicants not chosen to discuss other PHS opportunities
- FDA experiential program deployment presentation in addition to general PHS presentation
- o Recruitment presentation has been revised and will be posted

- ◆ Ex-Minimus Agencies CDR Chris Allen provided a report from CDC
 - o Released state of CDC report (available at www.cdc.gov/about/stateofcdc); provides overview of history and activities
 - LCDR Yon Yu served as a delegate at the APhA annual meeting in Atlanta in March; she reported on the following issues:
 - Expansion of pharmacist patient care role to include independent prescriptive authority to enhance healthcare outcomes
 - Recognition of pharmacists as primary care providers in community based health clinics
 - Protection of pharmacist personal information
 - Support for development of safe, effective, affordable generic versions of biologic drug products
 - Opposing redistribution of previously dispensed medications once they are out of the control of a health care provider
 - Support for increasing immunization rates for healthcare professionals and promotion of pharmacist based immunization services

 - o 2 BOP pharmacists attended the faculty immunization course at APhA meeting
- ♦ Food and Drug Administration (FDA) –CDR Matthew Tarosky
 - o Office of Regulatory Affairs reorganization unclear what effect these changes will have; also proposing to close 5 regional offices
 - Safety issues MedWatch is resource for timely information; 2 products have been withdrawn from the market
 - Zelnorm causes severe cardiovascular adverse events
 - Permax causes heart valve damage
- ♦ Office of the Secretary (OS) CDR Jacqueline Thomas
 - o New electronic CAD did not launch on April 2
 - New phone line calls will go directly to recruitment (for callers who have not submitted the PHS 50)
 - o LCDR Greg Davis has been selected to serve as special assistant in the OSG (CAPT Gil Rose's former position)
